It is not accurate to state that Maps B, C and D essentially keep ROCA intact for representation purposes. ROCA has been very active in working with the developers of the vacant land north of West El Camino and west of the drainage canal as well as in the development of Barandas park. These properties are considered an integral part of our community and their development will have a very significant impact on the rest of ROCA. These three maps would not keep the Willowbrook development fees in a single district and would complicate the execution of the community plan. ROCA strenuously opposes this division and asks that the commission reconsider this division.
