

RESOLUTION NO. 2008-407

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

June 17, 2008

APPROVING THE USE OF A COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT FOR THE PURCHASE OF FUEL FOR FLEET EQUIPMENT

BACKGROUND

- A. Department of General Services, Fleet Management Division has ongoing requirements to purchase supplies through contracts of other governmental jurisdictions including Sacramento County. The City has an opportunity to obtain lower pricing for these items through volume purchasing.
- B. In accordance with City Code 3.56.240, the City Manager may, by cooperative purchasing agreements approved by City Council, purchase supplies through contracts of other governmental jurisdictions without separate competitive bidding, where it is advantageous to the City.
- C. On March 25, 2008, City Council adopted Resolution No. 2008-175, approving the use of a cooperative purchasing agreement between the County of Sacramento (County) and Hunt & Sons and authorizing expenditures to Hunt & Sons under County contract WA00019302 in an amount not to exceed \$13.5 million for the purchase of motor fuel.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The current contract with the County of Sacramento (WA00019302) is increased for the purchase of additional fuel from Hunt & Sons for a total amount not to exceed \$4.0 million through August 31, 2008 or until the contract is no longer available.
- Section 2. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to execute the necessary purchases in the amounts specified above provided that sufficient funds are available in the budget adopted for the applicable fiscal years.
- Section 3. Prior expenditures with Hunt & Sons in the amount of \$184,807 are hereby ratified.


