Title: Agreement: On-Call Building Securement Services

Location/Council District: Citywide

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution** 1) suspending competitive bidding in the best interests of the City for on-call building securement services; 2) authorizing the City Manager to execute Master Services Agreements (MSA), each MSA for a three year period, with B-Line Construction Company in the annual Not To Exceed (NTE) amount of \$100,000; Capitol Reconstruction Company, Incorporated in the annual NTE amount of \$100,000; and Gray Construction & Securement Services, Incorporated in the annual NTE amount of \$100,000 for On-Call Building Securement Services; 3) authorizing the City Manager to execute one year extensions for each MSA for the same yearly NTE amount as provided above for a total agreement term for each MSA not to exceed three years (including the initial term and extensions), provided that sufficient funds are available in the budget adopted for the applicable Fiscal Year; and 4) rejecting all prior bids submitted in December 2007.

Description/Analysis

Issue: The City Code requires contracts of \$100,000 or more to be formally bid prior to awarding these contracts. The Code Enforcement Department routinely contracts out this service in order to maintain and protect the public health and safety when property owners are unable to comply with the applicable codes in a timely, safe and satisfactory manner. The initial bids for this service (in December, 2007) were rejected by staff due to insufficient information provided by the City regarding multiple awards and pricing criteria. The multi-award contract was again formally bid on April 9, 2008 on Bid No. B081181060 for the Not to Exceed annual total-amount of \$300,000 (3 awards of NTE \$100,000 annually) for a period not to exceed three (3) years from date of the award. The

City received seven responses. Following an analysis of the bids based on the lowest daytime hourly rates, the master service agreements were awarded to three contractors: 1) B-Line Construction Company, 2) Capitol Reconstruction Company, Incorporated, and 3) Gray Construction and Securement Services, Incorporated.

Policy Considerations: The recommendations in this report are in accordance with the provisions of City Code Section 3.56.

Committee/Commission Action: None

Environmental Considerations: Under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, administration of a Master Services Agreement does not constitute a project and is therefore exempt from review.


Sustainability Considerations: There are no applicable sustainability considerations.

Rationale for Recommendation: Formal bids for this non-professional service were solicited, and of the bids received, the three lowest bidders were: B-Line Construction Company, Capitol Reconstruction Company, Incorporated, and Gray Construction and Securement Services, Incorporated. The use of these three contractors on a rotation list will enable the department to provide securements to non-compliant properties according to building, health and safety codes.

Financial Considerations: The Code Enforcement Department operating budget will fund these MSA agreements. Cost recovery for on-call building securement services is accomplished by: (1) invoicing the property owners; and/or (2) demands to title companies during escrow (sales/transfers of properties); and/or (3) liens placed on the property.



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Attachment 1**BACKGROUND**

During fiscal year 2007, there were 269 building securements performed by the Capitol Reconstruction Company and 279 building securements performed by the Gray Construction Company for a total of 548 building securements for a total cost of \$268,225. During fiscal year 2008, there were 542 building securements performed by the Capitol Reconstruction Company, 214 securements performed by the Gray Construction Company, and 4 securements performed by the B-Line Construction Company for a total of 760 securements at a total cost of \$397,328. As the need for this service continues to increase, the Code Enforcement Department and Procurement Services Department performed a formal bid solicitation on-line as well as outreach by mail and phone contact. A Request for Qualifications (RFQ) was advertised on the City of Sacramento public website in "Contracting Opportunities," and four contractors submitted bids for the On-Call rotation list. Following the bidding which closed on April 9, 2008, the bid evaluation was performed by Procurement Services based on the daytime labor rates. The three contractors with the lowest daytime labor rates were selected who satisfied Code Enforcement's project requirements as well as the City's standard non-professional service bid requirements, i.e. City business license, current insurance coverage, etc. The firms to be awarded the City's On-Call Building Securement Services contracts are: 1) B-Line Construction Company, 2) Capitol Reconstruction Company, Incorporated, and 3) Gray Construction and Securement Services, Incorporated. The annual total for these contracts shall not exceed \$300,000 for a period not to exceed three (3) years from the date of award.

**APPROVING MASTER SERVICES AGREEMENTS FOR ON-CALL BUILDING
SECUREMENT SERVICES**

BACKGROUND

The purpose of the Master Services Agreements is to provide the City with an "On-Call" list of contractors that will provide on-call building securement service on a rotational basis. This program eliminates the need to individually bid each building securement Code Enforcement case. The "On-Call" list of contractors will allow a quicker response to these types of cases citywide. The increasing need for on-call building securement service is illustrated by the volumes for the past 2 years which were 548 in Fiscal Year 2007 and 760 in Fiscal Year 2008.

Contractors were recommended for approval based on the following criteria listed:

- Responsiveness
- Experience and appropriate licenses
- Pricing
- Registered Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD) (additional points awarded)

The term of the proposed Agreements is 1 year from the date of the execution. The City may opt to extend the contract period for an additional year for a total of three years.

Formal bids for this non-professional service were solicited, and of the bids received, the three lowest bidders were: B-Line Construction Company, Capitol Reconstruction Company, Incorporated, and Gray Construction and Securement Services, Incorporated. The use of these three contractors on a rotation list will enable the department to provide securements to non-compliant properties according to building, health and safety codes.

Based on the above, it is in the best interests of the City to suspend competitive bidding to allow the City to enter into Master Services Agreements (MSA) with the 3 contractors: B-Line Construction Company, Capitol Reconstruction Company, Incorporated, and Gray Construction and Securement Services, Incorporated; each in the annual Not To Exceed Amount of \$100,000.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. In the best interests of the City, competitive bidding is suspended for on-call building securement services.
- Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to execute Master Services Agreements (MSA) for on-call building securement service, each MSA for a one year period, with B-Line Construction Company, Capitol Reconstruction Company, Incorporated, and Gray Construction and Securement Services, Incorporated; each in the annual Not To Exceed Amount of \$100,000.
- Section 3. Each MSA provides for initial one year terms, each with the option to extend for an additional one year term, each for a total term of three years (including the initial term and extension). The City Manager may authorize such extensions for the annual Not to Exceed amount of \$100,000, provided sufficient funds are available in the budget adopted for the applicable Fiscal Year.
- Section 4. Rejection of all prior bids submitted in December 2007.
