Title: Grant/Agreement: California Task Force Seven (CA TF-7), Urban Search and Rescue (US&R) Team's Hurricane Gustav Deployment (G12701600)

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution: 1)** authorizing the City Manager, or his designee, to execute the agreement (EMW-2008-CA-1498) accepting federal funding in the amount of \$56,000 for the California Task Force Seven (CA TF-7), Urban Search and Rescue Team (US&R) Hurricane Gustav Deployment; **2)** establishing an operating grant for CA TF-7 US&R Hurricane Gustav Deployment (G12701600); and **3)** establishing an \$56,000 revenue and expenditure budget for the CA TF-7 US&R Hurricane Gustav Deployment (G12701600).

Description/Analysis

Issue: On September 6, 2008, two members of CA TF-7 were activated by the Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency (DHS/FEMA) for response to Hurricane Gustav. As the sponsoring agency for CA TF-7, US&R program, the City of Sacramento must sign the DHS/FEMA Assistant Award/Amendment contract (EMW-2008-CA-1498) in the amount of \$56,000, to receive reimbursement for costs associated with this deployment.

Policy Considerations: Acceptance of the federal US&R funding is consistent with City Council action relative to state and federal grant awards.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): Ongoing administrative maintenance activities, such as purchases of supplies, equipment or materials which are not made for purposes of a public construction project, do not constitute a "project" and are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061(b)(1), 15378(b)(3).

Sustainability Considerations: There are no sustainability considerations applicable to the acceptance of federal funding reimbursing DHS/FEMA directed activities.


Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: DHS/FEMA Assistant Award/Amendment contract (EMW-2008-CA-1498) in the amount of \$56,000, must be signed and submitted to DHS/FEMA to receive reimbursement for costs associated with the Hurricane Gustav deployment. (The contract EMW-2008-CA-1498 is on file and available for review online at the City's website and in the Office of the City Clerk.)

Financial Considerations: As the sponsoring agency, the City Of Sacramento incurs costs related to the activation of the CA TF-7 US&R team. DHS/FEMA reimburses expenses directly related to each event where team members are deployed. This is a new agreement for deployments beginning in 2008, against which other amendments will be issued for subsequent deployments. This contract allows DHS/FEMA to obligate \$56,000 of federal funds (Fund 2702) to cover expenses incurred by the City in its response to Hurricane Gustav.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): Only labor expenses have been incurred under this report, through agencies on current MOA agreements.



GRANT: CALIFORNIA TASK FORCE SEVEN (CA TF-7), URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE (US&R) TEAM RESPONSE TO HURRICANE GUSTAV (G12701600)

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento Fire Department has been the sponsoring agency for CA TF-7, US&R team since the inception of the Federal Urban Search & Rescue program in the early 1990's. CA TF-7 has responded for emergency assistance to the bombing of the Federal Murrah building in Oklahoma City, the terrorist attack of the World Trade Center in New York, to the Gulf Coast in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina and various other events.
- B. CA TF-7 can be deployed as an entire team, or individual members, to provide overhead support to natural disasters and national security events.
- C. On September 6, 2008, two (2) members of CA TF-7 were activated by the Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency (DHS/FEMA) for response to Hurricane Gustav.
- D. To receive reimbursement for costs associated with the deployment of personnel to Hurricane Gustav, the City must adopt a resolution granting signature authority for the City Manager to sign the DHS/FEMA Assistance Award/Amendment EMW-2008-CA-1498.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager, or his designee, is authorized to execute the agreement (EMW-2008-CA-1498) to accept the federal funding for California Task Force Seven, Urban Search and Rescue Team (CA TF-7 US&R), in the amount of \$56,000.
- Section 2. An operating grant shall be established for the CA TF-7 US&R Hurricane Gustav Deployment (G12701600).
- Section 3. A revenue and expenditure budget in the amount of \$56,000 shall be established for the CA TF-7 US&R Hurricane Gustav Deployment (G12701600).
