Here are the implementation measures we discussed. There are really only a few here--we're not very far apart.

E.R. 6.1.10 - Reduced Emissions

Table 4-10, #14 (p. 72 of Supp. Staff Rpt): "The City shall conduct a study to explore ways to enforce existing ordinance that limits idling of diesel vehicles used in construction projects." [Can the City say that it will enforce the ordinance?]

LU 2.6.1-Sustainable Development Patterns

Table 4-7, #10 "The City shall conduct a study to explore the feasibility of renovating existing buildings to a higher level of water efficiency."

Table 4-7, #11 "The City shall conduct a study to explore the feasibility of developing and implementing an energy and water retrofit ordinance for existing development."

(p. 78 of Supp. Staff Rpt)

[Can the City say that it will prepare and adopt an energy and water retrofit ordinance?]

LU 2.6.3 - Sustainable Building Practices

Table 4-7, #9 Green Building Rating Program - [Is there a target date to develop this ordinance? Include a proposed ordinance in the Climate Action Plan, e.g.?)

U 6.1.11 Energy Efficiency Improvements

New implementation measure: "The City shall conduct a study to review and update the existing residential energy conservation ordinance (RECO). . ."

[Can the City say that it will update and enforce the RECO?]

Also, on LU 2.6.6 - Heat Island Effect. The policy states that the City will promote features such as reflective roofing, green roofs, light-colored pavement, and urban shade trees and by reducing the unshaded extent of parking lots. (p. 80 of Supp. Staff Rpt.) The implementing measures for this policy are #s 10 and 11 from Table 4-7, discussed above. Is there anything more specific the City can do to "promote" these features? Can you say, e.g., that the City will consider these features in its Green Building Ordinance? Or that the City will consider how these features could be made part of its Climate Action Plan? These are good features and should be included in future climate change actions.

Also, on the Climate Action Plan, I think you all are supporting the Planning Commission's recommendation that the CAP, once adopted, be made part of the General Plan? We think that's critical so that future projects are consistent with the CAP.
