Title: Grant Agreement: California Integrated Waste Management Board

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution:** 1) authorizing the City Manager or the City Manager's designee to execute all grant documents, including but not limited to, applications, agreements, amendments and requests for payment, necessary to secure grant funds for a 2008/2009 California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) grant agreement with the City of Sacramento in the amount of \$4,000 for the proper disposal of abandoned tires within the City of Sacramento; and 2) approving the establishment of a grant project and related expenditure and revenue budgets, contingent upon receipt of the grant.

Description/Analysis:

Issue: Risk Management submitted an application to CIWMB for the payment of the disposal fees associated with the collection of abandoned tires within the City of Sacramento. These abandoned tires are collected by Department of Transportation, Utilities, and Parks and Recreation and stored at the various Corporation Yards until a licensed tire recycler collects the tires and properly disposes them. The estimated annual cost of disposal is approximately \$4,000, and the City of Sacramento is seeking grant funds from the CIWMB to cover the costs for disposal of the abandoned tires with the City of Sacramento. This report recommends applying for this CIWMB grant and accepting funds for the abandoned tire disposal if the grant is awarded

Policy Considerations: The recommendations in this report are consistent with the provisions of City Code Section 17.72.030 as it relates to recycling of tires.

Committee/Commission Action: Not applicable

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): The current proposal involves acceptance of a State grant for the proper disposal of abandoned tires within the City of Sacramento. The proposal is not a 'project' in accordance with Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines because it does not have a potential for resulting in either direct or indirect physical changes in the environment. Therefore, as determined by the City's Environmental Services Planning Manager, no environmental review is necessary.


Sustainability Considerations: The waste tires are being picked up by a licensed tire recycling company that is registered with the CIWMB.


Rationale for Recommendation: The City is currently collecting abandoned waste tires that create a public hazard within City. Various city departments collect these tires and store them at the north and south area Corporation Yards. A licensed tire recycle company retrieves the collected tires and properly disposes of them. It is estimated that approximately 2,220 abandoned waste tires are collected annually, costing the City \$4000 per year for proper disposal of the tires. If the abandoned tires are not collected, they present a public health hazard as they are a breeding ground for mosquitoes, thereby increasing the threat of spreading the West Nile Virus in our City.

The Risk Management Division is seeking to recover the costs for disposal of the abandoned waste tires. Accepting and executing the recommended grant agreement, if awarded, provides an opportunity for the City to recover the costs associated with the disposal of the abandoned waste tires.

Financial Considerations: The 2008/2009 CIWMB grant program provides recovery for fees incurred by the City of Sacramento, which are recoverable by the acceptance of this grant. The overall estimated cost of the project is \$4,000 annually.

AUTHORIZING THE APPLICATION FOR AND ACCEPTANCE OF A 2008/2009 CALIFORNIA INTEGRATED WASTE MANAGEMENT BOARD (CIWMB) GRANT AGREEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,000

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento is currently collecting abandoned waste tires that create a public hazard within City. Various city departments collect these tires and store them at the north and south area Corporation Yards. A licensed tire recycle company retrieves the collected tires and properly disposes of them. It is estimated that approximately 2,220 abandoned waste tires are collected annually, costing the City \$4000 per year for proper disposal of the tires. The Risk Management Division is seeking to recover the costs for disposal of the abandoned waste tires.

- B. Accepting and executing the recommended grant provides an opportunity for the City to recover the costs of properly disposing of the abandoned waste tires.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to execute all grant documents, including but not limited to, applications, agreements, amendments and requests for payment, necessary to secure grant funds for a 2008/2009 California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB) grant agreement with the City of Sacramento in the amount of \$4,000 for the proper disposal of abandoned tires within the City of Sacramento.

- Section 2. The establishment of a grant project and related expense and revenue budgets are approved, contingent upon receipt of the grant.
