APPLICATION FOR SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOLS FUNDING FOR BELL AVENUE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

BACKGROUND

- A. The State of California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has issued a call for projects to receive funding from the State Safe Routes to Schools Grant Program.
- B. Proposed projects for the Safe Routes to Schools Grant Program need to be easily deliverable without major right-of-way issues or complex environmental studies. The recommendations for this report are for funding infrastructure construction.
- C. The candidate location was taken from the 2008 Transportation Programming Guide (TPG). It was selected because it is the highest ranking location that best meets the grant funding objectives.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The Director of Transportation is authorized to submit an application for funding to the Safe Routes to Schools Grant Program for new sidewalk improvements for Bell Avenue Elementary School at Bell Avenue and Pinell Street. This project is to be submitted for State Safe Routes to Schools funding.


