APPLICATION FOR "COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY-BASED DATA-DRIVEN APPROACHES TO PREVENTING AND REDUCING VIOLENT CRIME" GRANT FROM THE EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM

BACKGROUND

- A. On February 17, 2009, President Obama signed into law the *American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009* which provides up to \$2 billion in grant funding for the Edward Byrne Memorial Competitive Grant program designed to help communities improve the capacity of state and local justice systems, and provide national support for training and technical assistance to address local needs.
- B. The "Comprehensive Community-Based Data-Driven Approaches to Preventing and Reducing Violent Crime" grant is part of the Edward Byrne Memorial Competitive Grant program which fights crime specifically through comprehensive, community-based data-driven approaches to reduce violent crime.
- C. The grant provides funding directly to law enforcement agencies to hire personnel in an effort to create and preserve jobs, and to increase their community policing capability and crime prevention efforts.
- D. As a designated eligible applicant, the City of Sacramento Police Department will compete for \$351,175 in funding to pay the cost of two full-time Reserve Officers for two years and grant-required travel, plus allowable federal indirect costs at a rate to be determined.
- E. The application deadline for this grant is April 27, 2009.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. On behalf of the City of Sacramento, the City Manager, or his designated representative, is hereby authorized to apply for FY2009 Edward Byrne Memorial Competitive Grant "Comprehensive Community-Based Data-Driven Approaches to Preventing and Reducing Violent Crime" including any necessary certifications for \$351,175, plus allowable federal indirect costs at a rate to be determined, from the U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance.
