Florin Road, 24th and 25th Streets; Temporary Closure Proceeding

Location/Council District: The Alleyway located between Yreka Avenue, Florin Road,
24th and 25th Streets in Council District 5 (see Attachment 2, Page 5).

subject alleyway.

Description/Analysis

Issue: The property owner's have requested the temporary closures of the
subject alleyway to help eliminate or reduce the amount of criminal activity by
restricting vehicular and pedestrian traffic within the alleyway.

A summary of the project's history is included in Attachment 1, Page 4.

Policy Considerations: The procedures under which the restriction of traffic is
being initiated are set forth in the Vehicle Code Section 21101.4 and Sacramento
City Code Chapter 12.16 allowing the temporary closure of alleys for the
protection or preservation of the public peace, safety, health or welfare. This
temporary closure is consistent with the City's Strategic Plan focus area in that it
will improve and expand public safety, achieve sustainability and enhance
livability. This is in keeping with the City's vision of being the most livable city in
America.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): The Environmental Planning Services section of the Development Services Department has reviewed the proposed temporary street closure and determined that the activity is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15301(f) of the CEQA Guidelines. This project consists of the temporary closure of an existing alley by adding a gate to the entrance of the alley. This project falls under CEQA Guidelines of Categorical Exemptions Section 15301(f) in that this temporary street closure involves no expansion of use beyond what currently exists. Access to the road will be given to appropriate departments and agencies.

Sustainability Considerations: None


Committee/Commission Action: None

Rationale for Recommendation: Adoption of the attached Resolution will provide additional security for the property owners by eliminating the opportunity for individuals to commit illegal acts and illegally dump within this subject alleyway.

Financial Considerations: The cost associated with this request is paid by the Alley Abatement Program (T15090900). The total estimated cost to process this alley request is \$6,000; fifty percent of the total costs will be paid for by the Alley Abatement Program (T15090900) and the other fifty percent will be paid for by City Council District 5 discretionary fund. There are no general funds planned or allocated for this project.

As of March 5, 2009 the Alley Abatement Program (T15090900) has a total budget of \$60,000 and an unobligated balance of \$60,000.

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Attachment 1**Background**

The proposed Temporary Closure of the subject alleyway was requested by adjacent property owners. The subject alleyway is currently unrestricted to vehicular and pedestrian traffic. This accessibility has allowed the alleyway to be utilized as a conduit for illegal activity such as theft, drug use, prostitution and illegal dumping. Many of these activities have been documented by the Sacramento Police Department in which over a one year span from 2008 to 2009 more than several hundred calls for service have been reported. With this number of calls for service the Police Department supports Temporary Closures of both alleyways. (see Attachments 3 Pages 6).

The Temporary Closure of the alleyway will entail the installation of two wrought iron gates within the alley. This will limit vehicular and pedestrian access to the property owners, City maintenance personnel and affected utility companies. The Temporary Closure of this alleyway will assist in deterring criminal activity and reducing the number of vehicles and pedestrians utilizing the alleyway as a means to conduct criminal acts.

The total estimated cost of installing the two (2) wrought iron gates with appropriate signs and locks will be \$6,000.00. This cost will be shared between the City of Sacramento's Problem Alley Abatement Program and City Council District 5. Each entity will pay fifty percent (\$3,000.00) towards the cost of installing the gates and required signs.

In addition to the Police Department's support of the Temporary Closure of the subject alleyway, the City of Sacramento Fire Department has also given support to the Temporary Closure of the alleyway. The Fire Department certifies that the proposed Temporary Closure of the alleyway will not adversely impact their operation or the safety within the surrounding neighborhoods (see Attachments 4 Pages 7).


The Temporary Closure of the subject alleyway is supported by the City of Sacramento's Department of Transportation (DOT). DOT certifies that both of the proposed Temporary Closures of the alleyway does not include a through highway or arterial street and that the alleyway closure allows adequate and safe traffic circulation on the adjacent streets (see Attachments 5 Pages 8).

The Temporary Street Closure is not to exceed (18) months unless the closure is properly extended. Once approved, the closure may be extended for an additional five (5) consecutive periods of not more than eighteen (18) months each. Prior to each extension, City Council must hold a Public Hearing. Noticing to the public regarding the temporary street closure has been completed prior to this City Council meeting in accordance with City Code section 12.16.220.

The majority of the adjacent property owners along with City staff support the Temporary Closures of this subject alleyway.

RESOLUTION NO.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TEMPORARY STREET CLOSURE OF THE ALLEYWAY BOUNDED BY YREKA AVENUE, FLORIN ROAD, 24TH AND 25TH STREETS PROCEEDING NO. TSC09-02

BACKGROUND

- A. The City received a request from the adjacent property owners for a Temporary Closure of the subject alleyway.
- B. City Council District 5 has agreed to pay 50 percent of the total costs to construct the alley gates and placement of the necessary signage. The other 50 percent of total costs will be paid for by the City's Department of Transportation's Problem Alley Abatement Program.
- C. In accordance with Section 21101.4 of the Vehicle Code of the State of California and with Chapter 12.16 of the Sacramento City Code, the City Council hereby considers approval of the Temporary Street Closure of traffic on the following subject alley to help prevent future criminal acts.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Based upon substantial evidence present in the record of the proceedings regarding this matter, City Council hereby makes the following findings:
- a) There is serious and continual criminal activity in the area of the subject alleyway recommended for closure. This finding is based upon a recommendation of the Police Department.
 - b) The alleyways recommended for closure is under the City's jurisdiction and has not been designated as a through highway or arterial street.
 - c) Vehicle or pedestrian traffic in the alleyways recommended for closure contributes to the criminal activity that is occurring there.
 - d) The alleyway closure will not substantially adversely affect traffic flow, safety on the streets or in the surrounding neighborhoods, the operation of emergency vehicles, the performance of municipal or

public utility services, or the delivery of freight by commercial vehicles in the area of the street recommended for closure.

- Section 2. The Temporary Street Closure of vehicular traffic through the subject alleyway listed is necessary for the protection or preservation of the public peace, safety, health or welfare of the neighborhood.
- Section 3. The Council finds and determines that the subject alley closure will substantially alleviate the existing serious and continual criminal activity in that alley.
- Section 4. City Council grants the Temporary Street Closure of the subject alley with the following conditions:
- a) A locking security device approved by the Sacramento Fire Department will be installed on the on each gate.
 - b) City departments and utility companies will have twenty-four (24) hour access to their facilities within the alley.
 - c) Signs giving notice of such restrictions shall be installed at the entrances to the subject alley prior to the installation of the gate security device.
 - d) The locking security device shall not be operated in a selective manner that restricts the access of some vehicles and/or pedestrians to the subject alley, while permitting other vehicles and pedestrians unrestricted access to the alley.
 - e) In the event that the security device requires construction by a private entity for improvements in the public right-of-way, a revocable encroachment permit and an excavation permit must be obtained from the Department of Transportation. The revocable encroachment permit is to be issued simultaneously with this Resolution. The excavation permit, if required, may be issued subsequent to this Resolution, but must be obtained prior to the construction of improvements in the public right-of-way. Staff recommends that the City Manager waive the fee for the revocable encroachment permit.
