

RESOLUTION NO. 2009-455

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

July 14, 2009

SUSPENDING COMPETITIVE BIDDING AND AWARDING A CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF FLEET TELEMETRICS EQUIPMENT AND RELATED SERVICES

BACKGROUND

- A. The implementation of a comprehensive fleet telematics solution on City fleet vehicles is consistent with the Fleet Sustainability Policy adopted by City Council on January 27, 2009.
- B. In accordance with City Code Section 3.56.230, the City Council may, by a two-thirds vote, suspend competitive bidding for any purchase or contract in the best interests of the City. Suspending competitive bidding and awarding a five year contract to Zonar Systems is in the best interest of the City for the following reasons: 1) the Zonar Systems product includes features that meet the needs of the City; and 2) market research by Fleet Management staff confirms there is no other manufacturer that offers a GPS product with an integrated, electronic verified pre-trip and post-trip vehicle inspection feature.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. It is in the best interests of the City to suspend competitive bidding, and competitive bidding is hereby suspended for the purchase of fleet telematics equipment and related services.
- Section 2. Zonar Systems is awarded a five-year contract for the purchase of fleet telematics equipment and related services in a total amount not to exceed \$2.6 million.
- Section 3. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to execute the contract specified above and make related expenditures provided that sufficient funds are available in the budget adopted for the applicable fiscal year(s).




