Description/Analysis

Issue: The City Council approved Resolution 2009-459 on July 14, 2009, allowing the City Manager to accept the U.S. Department of Homeland Security FY09 UASI grant. The California Emergency Management Agency advised us updated language is required to comply with federal grant guidance in order for the City of Sacramento to receive the U.S. Department of Homeland Security FY09 UASI grant funding. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security has awarded the Sacramento Regional Office of Homeland Security \$3,150,680 in funding to continue the region's UASI Program. The grant award, which encompasses three-years from October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2012, will provide funding to implement the goals and objectives of the Sacramento Region's Homeland Security Program.

This funding will allow the Sacramento Police Department's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (Organization 11001411) to maintain the full-time equivalent positions approved in City Council Resolutions: Number 2007-175, dated March 27, 2007; Number 2004-855, dated November 4, 2004; Number 2003-792, dated November 13, 2003.

Policy Considerations: The Sacramento Region has previously accepted Homeland Security grant funds to implement programs to prevent, deter,

respond, and recover from both natural and man-made disasters. Regional Homeland Security funding has been previously received and approved through the following City Council Resolutions: Number 2008-605 dated, September 2, 2008; Number 2007-796, dated November 6, 2007; Number 2006-684, dated September 12, 2006; Number 2005-406, dated May 31, 2005; Number 2004-855, dated November 4, 2004; and Number 2003-792, dated November 13, 2003.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): This activity is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because it does not constitute a "project" as defined in section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines, and is otherwise exempt pursuant to Sections 15321(b) (law enforcement activities) and 15601(b)(3) (no significant effect on the environment) of the CEQA Guidelines.

Rationale for Recommendation: The City and County of Sacramento were initially awarded Homeland Security funding in FY 2003 to implement the region's Homeland Security UASI Program. Since that time, the Sacramento UASI Program has received program funding in Fiscal Years 2004 through 2008 to continue implementing multi-jurisdictional Homeland Security goals and objectives. In March 2009, Sacramento's Regional Homeland Security Office applied for competitive funding to continue implementing its Homeland Security Program and was subsequently awarded \$3,150,680 in programmatic funding from the Department of Homeland Security.

Financial Considerations: The Department of Homeland Security has awarded the Sacramento UASI \$3,150,680 in funding for FY's 2009/2010 to 2011/2012. This funding allocation will pay for 100% of program costs for implementing, coordinating and conducting Homeland Security program goals and objectives. No grant match funding is requested to implement this ongoing program. Funding from this grant award will be used to pay for equipment, labor costs and contractual agreements in accordance with the approved Homeland Security budgets and program guidelines. The term of the grant program is from October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2012; however, if applicable, the Department of Homeland Security may, at its discretion, extend the timeline for using this funding.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): Purchase of supplies and equipment will be made in accordance with the City's Emerging and Small Business Development (E/SBD) program requirements whenever possible.

In March 2009, Sacramento's Homeland Security Office applied for competitive Homeland Security grant funding and was subsequently awarded \$3,150,680 in federal funding to continue the Region's Homeland Security program for three years.

This funding will allow the Sacramento Police Department's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (Organization 11001411) to maintain the full-time equivalent positions approved in City Council Resolutions: Number 2007-175, dated March 27, 2007; Number 2004-855, dated November 4, 2004; Number 2003-792, dated November 13, 2003.

This funding allocation will pay for 100% of program costs for implementing, coordinating and conducting Homeland Security program goals and objectives. ADMINISTRATIVE MATTER: AMENDMENT TO RESOLUTION 2009-459 UASI Grant**BACKGROUND**

- A. The City Council previously approved Resolution 2009-459, dated July 14, 2009, for the acceptance and use of Homeland Security Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funding for Federal Fiscal Year 2009. The California Emergency Management Agency advised the Department updated language is required to comply with federal grant guidance in order for the City of Sacramento to receive this U.S. Department of Homeland Security FY09 UASI grant funding. This Resolution will amend the language in accordance with the California Emergency Management Agency's direction to the Sacramento UASI. Only Section 1 of Resolution 2009-459 is being amended by adding language identifying the Police Chief as being authorized to accept grant funding.
- B. The City Council has previously approved the acceptance and use of Homeland Security Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funding for Federal Fiscal Years 2003 through 2008. This funding is to implement programs to prevent, deter, respond, and recover from both natural and man-made disasters. This grant funding was approved by the following City Council Resolutions: Number 2008-605 dated, September 2, 2008; Number 2007-796, dated November 6, 2007; Number 2006-684, dated September 12, 2006; Number 2005-406, dated May 31, 2005; Number 2004-855, dated November 4, 2004; and Number 2003-792, dated November 13, 2003.
- C. This FY09 funding will allow the Sacramento Police Department's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (Organization 11001411) to maintain the full-time equivalent positions approved in City Council Resolutions: Number 2007-175, dated March 27, 2007; Number 2004-855, dated November 4, 2004; Number 2003-792, dated November 13, 2003.
- D. In March 2009, the Sacramento Office of Homeland Security submitted a competitive grant proposal to fund new and ongoing Regional UASI program projects. In June 2009, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security awarded \$3,150,680 in grant funding to implement the goals and objectives of the Sacramento Region's Homeland Security Program.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager or the Chief of Police, as his designee, are individually authorized, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, to accept \$3,150,680 in FY09 Homeland Security funds from California's Emergency Management

Agency including any extensions, amendments, or assurances, thereof, for continued funding of the Sacramento Regional UASI program. Except as specifically amended herein, all other provisions of Resolution 2009-459 remain in full force and effect including Sections 2, 3 and 4.
