

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-380

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

June 22, 2010

DEPARTMENT OF RESOURCES RECYCLING AND RECOVERY (CALRECYCLE) GRANT APPLICATION

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento accepts used oil and filters through the curbside recycling program and at the Permanent Household Hazardous Waste Facility and promotes the use of certified used oil collection centers.
- B. The improper disposal of used motor oil and filters is costly and environmentally hazardous. Grant funds are available to fund outreach and collection activities associated with increasing used oil and filter recycling.
- C. Solid Waste Services, Department of Utilities, has successfully used oil grant funds to promote the recycling of used oil and filters since 2000.
- D. Pursuant to Public Resources Code § 48690 the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle), formerly known as the California Integrated Waste Management Board, has established the Used Oil Payment Program (OPP) to make payments to qualifying jurisdictions for implementation of their used oil programs.
- E. CalRecycle's procedures for administering the program require, among other things, an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations related to the administration of the Used Oil Payment Program.
- F. Used Oil Payment Program funds will fund ongoing used oil recycling programs currently implemented by Solid Waste Services.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The Interim City Manager or his designee is authorized to submit applications to the State of California, Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) Used Oil Payment Program grants for an amount not to exceed \$200,00.
- Section 2. The Interim City Manager or his designee is authorized to execute all agreements necessary to accept and appropriate the grant funds from CalRecycle contingent upon receipt of grant awards.
- Section 3. The Director of Utilities and the Director's designees are authorized as the City's agent to submit all documents required in connection with the grant application, and if the grant is awarded, including but not limited to, agreements,

annual reports including expenditure reports and amendments necessary to secure said payments to support CalRecycle's Used Oil Collection Program.

Section 4. The Interim City Manager, or designee, is hereby authorized to establish a grant project for the Used Oil Payment Program grant and related revenue and expenditure budgets in the amount not to exceed \$200,000.


