

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-505

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

August 24, 2010

DETERMINING THE RESULT OF THE SPECIAL MAILED-BALLOT ELECTION HELD ON AUGUST 13, 2010, WITHIN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO REDDING AVENUE LANDSCAPING COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2010-04

BACKGROUND:

- A. The City Clerk has duly canvassed the votes cast by the qualified electors within the City of Sacramento Redding Avenue Landscaping Community Facilities District No. 2010-04 (the District) at the special mailed-ballot election held within the District on August 13, 2010, upon the proposition set forth below.
- B. The City Clerk has certified to the City Council the result of the votes cast at the special mailed-ballot election upon the proposition, and the certification is now on file in the City Clerk's office.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The statements in paragraphs A and B of the Background are accurate.

Section 2. At the special mailed-ballot election, the following proposition was submitted to the qualified voters of the District:

Shall the City of Sacramento Redding Avenue Landscaping Community Facilities District No. 2010-04 ("the CFD") be authorized to finance the maintenance of landscaped areas to be constructed along the Redding Avenue corridor, as more fully described in Resolution No. 2010-326 adopted by the City Council on June 15, 2010, and incorporated herein by reference; and shall an appropriations limit in the amount of \$10,000 per fiscal year in connection therewith be established for the CFD; and shall a special tax with a maximum rate and method of apportionment as provided in Resolution No. 2010-326 be levied to pay for the maintenance of the landscaped areas?

Section 3. The canvass of the votes cast at the special mailed-ballot election held in the District on August 13, 2010, as shown by the City Clerk's certification, is approved and confirmed.

Section 4. The total number of votes cast for and against the proposition at the special mailed-ballot election in the District, as set forth in the canvass, is as follows:

Total Votes: 7,000 Votes For: 6,944 Votes Against: 56

Section 5. More than two-thirds (2/3) of all votes cast at the special mailed-ballot election were cast in favor of the proposition, and the proposition carried.

Section 6. The City Clerk is directed to enter this resolution on the minutes of the City Council, and that entry will constitute the official declaration of the result of the special mailed-ballot election. The City Clerk is further authorized and directed to record a notice of special tax lien in accordance with Streets and Highways Code section 3114.5.


