Description/Analysis

Issue: The project consists of accessibility and pedestrian improvements at various locations in the Carleton Tract Neighborhood and Colonial Heights Neighborhood in Council District 5. Improvements include construction of alleys and residential driveways, infill sidewalks, and curb ramps. City staff will construct the proposed improvements. City Council approval of the Plans and Specifications is necessary to move forward with construction.

Policy Considerations: The action requested herein is consistent with the Sacramento City Code, Title 3 and with the City of Sacramento Strategic Plan goals of achieving sustainability and neighborhood livability.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): The Community Development Department, Environmental Planning Services Division has reviewed this project and determined that it is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Class 1, Section 15301(c), Class 2,

Section 15302(c), Class 3, Section 15303(d), Class 4, Section 15304(b) and Class 11, Section 15311(a).

Projects exempted under Class 1, Section 15301(c) consist of the operation, repair or minor alteration to existing highways and streets, sidewalks, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities. Projects exempted under Class 2, Section 15302(c) consist of the replacement of existing utility systems and/or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of capacity. Projects exempted under Class 3, Section number 15303(d) consist of new construction of small structures including street improvements. Project exempted under Class 4, Section number 15304(b) consist of new gardening or landscaping. Projects exempted under Class 11, Section 15311(a) consist of the construction or replacement of minor structures accessory to existing facilities including but not limited to on-premise signs.

Sustainability Considerations: This project promotes alternate modes of transportation by providing accessible paths of travel for pedestrians.

Other: None.


Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: City Council approval of the Plans and Specifications is necessary to move forward with construction.

Financial Considerations: The District 5 Accessibility and Pedestrian Improvement Project (T15095400) has a total budget of \$379,984 consisting of \$348,000 of SHRA Community Development Block Grant Funds (Fund 2700) and \$31,984 of Local Transportation Tax funds (Fund 2001). The estimated total project cost for the District 5 Accessibility and Pedestrian Improvement Project (T15095400) is \$368,000. The project has an unobligated balance of \$342,593, which is sufficient to construct the proposed improvements.

There are no general funds (Fund 1001) planned or allocated for this project.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): The project is Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funded, and Minority and Women Owned Enterprise (M/WBE) project participation requirements apply if the project were advertised for bids. However, because all construction activities will be completed with city staff, MWBE and Emerging and Small Business Enterprise (E/SBE) requirements do not apply.

- Section 2. Exhibit A is incorporated into and made part of this Resolution.


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Exhibit A: Map of Carleton Tract Neighborhood and Colonial Heights Neighborhood


