AGREEMENT FOR WORKERS' COMPENSATION CLAIMS ON-LINE SOFTWARE PROGRAM

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento currently owns a P&C Claims Inc. Workers' Compensation Claims Management System License which staff utilize to process the City's workers' compensation claims. The current maintenance contract with P&C Claims, Inc. is expiring and needs to be renewed.
- B. It is in the City's best interest to execute a new contract with P&C Claims, Inc. as the costs are much lower than purchasing a new license from a different vendor and transferring our existing data to the new system. P&C Claims, Inc. is also the only vendor that can maintain the current system. Additionally, staff is pleased with the current program's performance.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. In the best interest of the City, competitive bidding is hereby suspended for the maintenance of the P&C Claims, Inc. Worker's Compensation Claims Management System License and on-line software program. P&C Claims, Inc. is the only vendor that can maintain our current system and purchasing a new system would be very expensive.
- Section 2 The City Manager is authorized to execute an agreement with P&C Claims, Inc. for a workers' compensation on-line software program for a term of thirty six (36) months with the City's option to renew for two (2) twelve (12) month periods at a cost not to exceed \$669,446 for the five (5) year term.


