Title: Agreement: Sacramento START State Grant

Location/Council District: Multiple locations within and outside the City limits

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution 1)** authorizing the City Manager to execute an agreement and any extensions, amendments, reapplications or other related documents with the State of California as necessary for the City to accept funding for a one-year grant for the Sacramento START (Students Today Achieving Results for Tomorrow) after-school program in an amount not to exceed \$5,327,075 during Fiscal Year (FY) 2010/11; **2)** authorizing the City Manager to execute any amendments, subject to approval as to form by the City Attorney, with the State of California that increase the maximum grant amount by up to ten percent (10%) of the original grant amount or that decrease the maximum grant amount by any amount; and **3)** authorizing the City Manager or designee to adjust the necessary operating revenue and expenditure budgets to implement the grant.

Description/Analysis

Issue: The Sacramento START program has been operating for many years through a grant from the California Department of Education. The State has sent the City an agreement for the next year of grant funding through June 30, 2011. City Council is being asked to authorize the City Manager to sign the agreement.

Policy Considerations: Continued participation in the Sacramento START program is consistent with the City's strategic plan to enhance livability.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): This report concerns administrative activities that will not have any significant effect on the

environment and that do not constitute a "project," as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) [CEQA Guidelines (Title 14 Cal. Code Reg. § 15000 et seq.) sections 15061(b)(3); 15378(b)(2)].

Sustainability Considerations: Approval for the signature of the grant agreement is not applicable to the goals, policies and targets of the Sustainability Master Plan or the 2030 General Plan.

Commission/Committee Action: None

Rationale for Recommendation: Signing the agreement to accept State funding for the next year of operations will allow thousands of elementary school children to participate in the Sacramento START after-school literacy and enrichment program.

Financial Considerations: The State has awarded the City a maximum of \$5,327,075 in FY2010/11 to operate the START program at 43 elementary schools. In order to earn this amount, the program must be operated in accordance with the approved grant application and State law; student attendance must be maintained at minimum levels; and local matching funds must be spent, either by direct cash expenditures or in-kind contributions. The Sacramento START program, operating within the START Fund 2501, will meet its grant match requirement within the existing operating budget by reporting to the State its direct General Fund expenditures, its in-kind expenditures for the AmeriCorps and Snack grants and other in-kind expenditures. No additional General Fund appropriation is required.

During the year the State may offer the City the ability to increase the maximum grant award or may be required to reduce the maximum grant award. Provided the START program has the capacity and willingness to operate an enhanced program at existing sites or at additional sites, approval is requested to authorize the City Manager to execute amendments that increase the maximum grant award by up to ten percent (10%) of the original grant award (up to \$532,707) or that decrease the grant award.





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**Attachment 1****Background**

Sacramento START (Students Today Achieving Results for Tomorrow) was launched in 1996. Today, START is widely recognized as one of the most outstanding after-school literacy and enrichment programs in the country, serving thousands of elementary school children in the most disadvantaged areas of the City and County. The City of Sacramento through its Parks and Recreation Department provides management and administrative support. Funding is provided through a partnership with the California Department of Education, the City of Sacramento, three participating school districts (Natomas Unified, Robla and Sacramento City Unified), and donations from foundations, businesses and individuals. A significant portion of the funding comes from the State or from school districts whose funding comes from the State. No fees are charged to the children or their parents.

State law governs the overall structure of the START program, which is part of the State's After School Education and Safety (ASES) program. Requirements cover the duration and frequency of the program, the required ratio of staff to children, staff background and education qualifications, reimbursement rate, the percent of local matching funds and the need for an evaluation.

In addition to the 43 elementary school sites covered by this grant agreement, Sacramento START also operates its program at 14 sites as a result of being a subcontractor of three school districts (Elk Grove Unified, Sacramento City Unified and Twin Rivers Unified) that receive their own grant from the State. The subcontractor agreement with Sacramento City Unified is expected to be on the October 26 City Council agenda, and Elk Grove and Twin Rivers are preparing contracts that will be brought to City Council when complete.

Attachment 2 provides a list of all of the Sacramento START elementary school locations, showing whether the site is part of the City's grant award for which signature authority is being requested, or is being subcontracted from a school district.

APPROVING START STATE GRANT AGREEMENT

BACKGROUND

- A. The Department of Parks and Recreation has operated the Sacramento START (Students Today Achieving Results for Tomorrow) after-school literacy and enrichment program since 1996. A significant portion of the funding for the program comes from the State of California.
- B. The State has approved funding for the next year of the program for 43 elementary school sites.
- C. The State has awarded the City a maximum of \$5,327,075 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2010/11. In order to earn this amount, the program must be operated in accordance with the approved grant application and State law; student attendance must be maintained at minimum levels; and local matching funds must be spent, either by direct cash expenditures or in-kind contributions.
- D. The Sacramento START program, operating within the START Fund 2501, will meet its grant match requirement within the existing operating budget by reporting to the State its direct General Fund expenditures, its in-kind expenditures for the AmeriCorps and Snack grants and other in-kind expenditures. No additional General Fund appropriation is required.



1. The grantee will follow its program plans as specified in the agency application.
2. The grantee will submit reports to the California Department of Education (CDE) as necessary to enable the CDE to perform its duties, and will maintain such records and provide access to those records, as the CDE deems necessary. The grantee shall maintain such records for at least five years after the completion of the activities for which the funds are used.
3. The grantee will make any application, evaluation, periodic program plan, or report relating to each program available to parents and other members of the general public. (California Public Records Act, *Government Code* Section 6250 et seq.)
4. No more than 15 percent of grant monies earned may be used for administrative costs (including indirect costs equal to the CDE-approved indirect cost rate or 5 percent, whichever is less).
