Title: Interagency Agreement: City of Sacramento/County of Sacramento –
Sacramento Regional Radio Communications System (SRRCS)

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution** 1) suspending competitive bidding in the best interests of the City; and 2) authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute a ten-year Licensing Agreement between the City of Sacramento (City) and County of Sacramento (County) for the City's use of and participation in the Sacramento Regional Radio Communications System.

Description/Analysis

Issue: On October 19, 1993, City Council adopted a resolution (Reso No. 93-585) authorizing a licensing agreement between the City and County of Sacramento (City Agreement No. 93-136) facilitating the City's participation in the Sacramento Regional Communications System (SRRCS). The SRRCS has provided the City with essential radio communication and connectivity services that directly supports the City's public safety and local government radio communication requirements. The City of Sacramento, the County of Sacramento, and other local government agencies have worked collaboratively in maintaining one of the of the most successful and robust regional communications system in the country. Today, the SRRCS serves the majority of the local government agencies within the entire Sacramento Region. This

proposed license agreement extends the partnership and participation for the City's continued use of the SRRCS an additional 10 years, through July 1, 2020.

Policy Considerations: This recommendation is in accordance with the FY-2009/10 Approved Budget Document's Strategic Planning Process. In particular, this recommendation is consistent with the Sustainable Budget Concept that includes the following areas:

- Continuous evaluation for efficiencies and effectiveness
- Identify return on investment and impacts; fiscal and social benefits


Environmental Considerations: The report does not constitute a "project" and is therefore exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) [CEQA Guidelines Sections 15061(b)(3);15378(b)(2)].

Rational for Recommendation: The City has been an active participant in SRRCS since the communications system became operational. If the City were to not sign this agreement, there are no other radio communication systems in place that would offer the same functions and capabilities that is offered through the SRRCS. The City would likely need to develop its own communications system and infrastructure at a cost of millions of dollars and several years to plan and implement.

Financial Considerations: The County charges the City an annual radio operation and system maintenance/enhancement fee based on the number of active radios operating under the SRRCS system. The current annual rate per radio is \$275 and the total number of City radios operating under the SRRCS is approximately 2,860. The City's annual charges (approximately \$786,000) are budgeted by fund in non-departmental budget. The General Fund portion is \$646,525; this amount has been budgeted in the FY2010/11 budget.





Background

On October 19, 1993, City Council adopted a resolution (Reso No. 93-585) authorizing an agreement between the City and County of Sacramento (City Agreement 93-136) facilitating the City's participation in the Sacramento Regional Communications System (SRRCS). The SRRCS provides essential radio communication and connectivity services that directly supports the City's public safety and local government radio communication requirements.

The County charges an annual maintenance fee per radio that supports system operation and enhancements/upgrades. Departments are:

LICENSING AGREEMENT FOR SACRAMENTO REGIONAL RADIO COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM (SRRCS)

BACKGROUND

- A. The Sacramento Regional Radio Communications System (SRRCS) provides public safety and local government communications radio system for the greater Sacramento Regional area. This includes the City of Sacramento's (City) public safety agencies and all of its local government departments. Becoming operational in 1995, SRRCS is owned and operated by the County of Sacramento (County).
- B. On October 19, 1993, City Council adopted a resolution (Reso No. 93-585) authorizing a licensing agreement between the City and County of Sacramento (City Agreement No. 93-136) facilitating the City's participation in the Sacramento Regional Communications System (SRRCS). The SRRCS has provided the City with essential radio communication and connectivity services that directly supports the City's public safety and local government radio communication requirements.
- C. This proposed license agreement extends the partnership and participation for the City's continued use of the SRRCS an additional 10 years, through July 1, 2020. If the City does not extend the agreement, there are no other radio communication systems in place that would offer the same functions and capabilities that is offered through the SRRCS. The City would likely need to develop its own communications system and infrastructure at a cost of millions of dollars and several years to plan and implement.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. In the best interest of the City, competitive bidding is suspended for radio communication and connectivity services.
- Section 2. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is hereby authorized to

execute a ten-year licensing agreement with the County of Sacramento for the City's use of and participation in the Sacramento Regional Radio Communications System.

Section 3. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is hereby authorized to execute such additional documents and to take such additional actions as necessary to implement the Licensing Agreement.
