### AWARD CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF THREE (3) PORTABLE SURVEILLANCE CAMERA TRAILERS

#### BACKGROUND

- A. On September 29, 2009, the City Council adopted Resolution #2009-618 authorizing the acceptance of FY08 Homeland Security funding from the California Emergency Management Agency for the purchase of surveillance trailers and other equipment for the designated purpose of improving the Police Departments ability to solve crimes, respond to natural or man-made disasters, and monitor events to ensure the safety of the public.
- B. On September 28, 2010, Procurement Services, in accordance with City Code Section 3.56, issued Invitation for Bid #B11131061004 for the purchase of three portable surveillance camera trailers. Five bids were received. The lowest responsive and responsible bidder was determined to be Absolute Surveillance.

#### BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Absolute Surveillance is awarded a contract for the purchase of three (3) surveillance trailers in an amount not to exceed \$245,009.61.



### **APPROVAL TO SUBMIT HIGHWAY SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (HSIP) APPLICATION**

#### **BACKGROUND**

- A. Caltrans has issued a call for projects for the federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP). Funds are available to solve safety issues on transportation facilities. Funding available for the 2010/11 Federal Fiscal Year is approximately \$70 million statewide. Staff recommendation is to submit an application to modify the intersection at Mack Road and Valley Hi Drive/La Mancha Way to enhance safety at the intersection.

#### **BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- Section 1. The Director of Transportation is authorized to submit an application for the Federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funding to modify the traffic signal and related improvements at Mack Road and Valley Hi Drive/La Mancha Way to enhance safety at the intersection.




