

RESOLUTION NO. 2010-719

AGREEMENT: PURCHASE OF A BALLISTIC ARMORED TACTICAL VEHICLE

BACKGROUND

- A. On September 2, 2008, the City Council adopted Resolution #2008-605 authorizing the acceptance of FY08 Homeland Security Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funding from the California Emergency Management Agency to implement the goals and objectives of the Sacramento Region's Homeland Security Program. Consistent with this purpose, the recommendation in this report makes use of grant funding to purchase a Ballistic Armored Tactical Vehicle (also known as a Regional Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and Explosive (CBRNE) armor-plated Rescue and Response Vehicle) as a regional asset to improve response to natural or man-made critical incidents.
- B. The current armored response vehicle is outdated and unsafe. Lenco Industries, Inc. is the only manufacturer which provides the highest level of ballistic protection to its occupants and is the only manufacturer to provide a self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) system which is capable of supplying respiratory protection and breathable air to ten occupants. This feature will improve regional capabilities to respond to chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive (CBRNE) incidents.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. In the best interest of the City, competitive bidding is hereby suspended for the purchase of one Ballistic Armored Tactical Vehicle (also known as a Regional Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and Explosive (CBRNE) armor-plated Rescue and Response Vehicle).
- Section 2. Lenco Industries, Inc. is awarded a commodities agreement (attached as Exhibit A and made a part of this Resolution) for the purchase of one Ballistic Armored Tactical Vehicle (also known as a Regional Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and Explosive (CBRNE) armor-plated Rescue and Response Vehicle) for an amount not to exceed \$316,000.


