Description/Analysis

Issue: The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) recommends the acceptance of \$369,309 in California Gang Reduction, Intervention and Prevention (CalGRIP) grant funding from the Governor's Office of Gang and Youth Violence Policy (OGYVP). The Sacramento CalGRIP Project is a three tier prevention and intervention project designed to target youth within the Sacramento City Unified School District that are at risk for gang participation and affiliation. The SPD will work with SCUSD and area partners to enhance education, prevention, and intervention programs through assessments and the implementation of evidence-based programming. The grant period is two years, from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2013.

Policy Considerations: The acceptance of this funding is consistent with past practices of using CalGRIP grant funding to enhance gang education, prevention and intervention programs. In addition, City Council Resolution #2010-388 requires City Council approval to accept grant funding, establish a grant project, and appropriate funding when the grant award is in excess of \$100,000.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): This action is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because it does not constitute a "project" as defined in section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines, and is otherwise exempt pursuant to section 15061(b)(3) (no significant effect on the environment) of the CEQA Guidelines.

Sustainability Considerations: There are no sustainability considerations associated with this report.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: Grant funding for the Sacramento CalGRIP Project will permit the Police Department and the Sacramento City Unified School District to enhance education, prevention, and intervention efforts targeting at-risk youth throughout the City of Sacramento. This project will provide universal prevention assemblies to all 4th through 8th grade students within the Sacramento City Unified School District.

Financial Considerations: The total grant award from the OGYVP is \$369,309. This grant will fund a three tier prevention and intervention project. It specifically provides funding for two (2) youth violence prevention specialists at Luther Burbank High School and Hiram Johnson High School. The grant also provides for two (2), full-time, intake counselors to conduct risk and needs assessments and case management for at-risk youth. This grant has an in-kind match requirement, which will be funded through current programs and staff time provided by the SPD and Sacramento City Unified School District. There is no current or future impact to the General Fund.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): Any grant-funded purchases will be made in accordance with the City's Emerging and Small Business Development program requirements.

Acceptance of CalGRIP Grant Funding to Implement the Sacramento Gang Prevention and Intervention Project

BACKGROUND

- A.** The Sacramento Police Department, in partnership with the Sacramento City Unified School District, will utilize funding from the Governor's Office of Gang and Youth Policy to implement the Sacramento Gang Prevention and Intervention Project. This project will provide universal prevention assemblies to all 4th through 8th grade students within the Sacramento City Unified School District. The program will provide intervention services to youth at risk for gang affiliation and participation.
- B.** The City of Sacramento has received other CalGRIP awards for similar projects in Fiscal Years 2007, 2008, and 2010.
- C.** The City of Sacramento has received a grant award for the amount of \$369,309 from the Governor's Office of Gang and Youth Policy to provide funding for the Sacramento Gang Prevention and Intervention Project.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to accept a grant award for the amount of \$369,309, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, from the Governor's Office of Gang and Youth Policy.
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to establish a CalGRIP Grant Project (#G11008900).
- Section 3. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust the necessary revenue and expense budgets by \$369,309 to implement the CalGRIP Project.
