

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2011-508**

### **ACCEPTANCE OF CALGRIP FUNDING TO IMPLEMENT THE SACRAMENTO GANG PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION PROJECT**

#### **BACKGROUND**

- A. The Sacramento Police Department, in partnership with the Sacramento City Unified School District, will utilize funding from the Governor's Office of Gang and Youth Policy to implement the Sacramento Gang Prevention and Intervention Project. This project will provide universal prevention assemblies to all 4<sup>th</sup> through 8<sup>th</sup> grade students within the Sacramento City Unified School District. The program will provide intervention services to youth at risk for gang affiliation and participation.
- B. The City of Sacramento has received other CalGRIP awards for similar projects in Fiscal Years 2007, 2008, and 2010.
- C. The City of Sacramento has received a grant award for the amount of \$369,309 from the Governor's Office of Gang and Youth Policy to provide funding for the Sacramento Gang Prevention and Intervention Project.

#### **BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to accept a grant award for the amount of \$369,309, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, from the Governor's Office of Gang and Youth Policy.
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to establish a CalGRIP Grant Project (#G11008900).
- Section 3. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust the necessary revenue and expense budgets by \$369,309 to implement the CalGRIP Project.

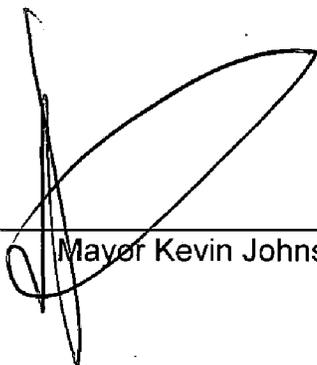
