RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF GRANT FUNDS FROM THE CALIFORNIA OFFICE OF TRAFFIC SAFETY TO CONDUCT CITYWIDE DUI ENFORCEMENT AND TRAFFIC SAFETY EDUCATION PROGRAMS

BACKGROUND

- A. In 2010, the Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) awarded the City of Sacramento approximately \$1.12 million in grants to fund Driving under the Influence (DUI) enforcement, media, intervention and traffic safety programs. The current grant programs funded by OTS are set to expire on September 30, 2011.
- B. In 2011, the Sacramento Police Department submitted new grant proposals to the California Office of Traffic Safety requesting funding for DUI traffic safety and education programs. In July 2011, the Office of Traffic Safety awarded the City of Sacramento \$1.135 million in grant funding to implement these traffic safety programs.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager, or his designee, is authorized to accept a grant award in the amount of up to \$1.135 million, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, from the California, Office of Traffic Safety, including any extensions or amendments thereof, to implement the DUI Enforcement Grant Program (\$735,000) and the DUI Education Grant Program (\$400,000).
- Section 2. The City Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized to establish grant projects for the FY2011/12 OTS programs, DUI Enforcement Grant Program (#G11009400) and the DUI Education Grant Program (#G11009500).
- Section 3. The City Manager, or his designee, is authorized to make the necessary grant expense and revenue budget adjustments to implement the \$1.135 million OTS grants.


