Description/Analysis

Issue: The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) is seeking approval to accept \$563,187 State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP) funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). This funding will be passed through the California Emergency Management Agency (CalEMA) and the County of Sacramento, Office of Emergency Services (SacOES). The purpose of the SHSGP is to provide funding to support the implementation of State Homeland Security strategies to address the identified planning, organization, equipment, training, and exercise needs at the state and local levels to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other catastrophic events.

Policy Considerations: Acceptance of SHSGP funding is consistent with the past practice of using State and federal grant funding to meet local needs. In addition, City Council Resolution #2011-391 requires City Council approval to accept grant funding, establish a grant project and appropriate funding when the grant award is in excess of \$100,000.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA):

Under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) guidelines Section 15378, continuing administrative activities do not constitute a project and are therefore exempt from review.

Sustainability Considerations: None.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: This SHSGP funding will provide critical equipment, risk assessment analysis and training for first responders to ensure the Sacramento Region works together to build, sustain, and improve its capability to prepare for, protect against, respond to, recover from, and mitigate all natural and manmade hazards.

The funds will be used to purchase the following: 1) one (1) replacement patrol boat, to be used as a regional asset in conjunction with the Sacramento Fire Department, for prevention, protection, and response to all-hazard emergencies in the Sacramento Region; 2) necessary equipment for the continuation of the Sacramento Regional Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) and Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) programs; 3) the continuation of the lease agreement with the Northern California Regional Public Safety Training Authority (NCRPSTA), a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) for the training facility/Emergency Operations Center (EOC) at 3720 Dudley Blvd, McClellan, California; 4) risk assessment, strategic plan.

Financial Considerations: There is no match requirement associated with the acceptance of the SHSGP funding, and there is no impact to the General Fund. The total grant award is \$563,187 and the planned grant activities include the following:

SHSGP FY11(Performance Period November 1, 2011 to December 30, 2013 and contingent upon SacOES award from CalEMA): One (1) regional replacement patrol boat: \$95,000; NCRPSTA lease (training facility/EOC at 3720 Dudley Blvd., McClellan, California): \$250,000; EOD and SWAT equipment including three (3) bomb blankets, two (2) tactical blankets, two (2) canine cameras, and five (5) complete EOD personal protective equipment suits \$68,187 (total amount \$413,187).

SHSGP FY10 (Performance Period October 25, 2010 to December 31, 2012): One (1) small platform robot: \$100,000.

SHSGP FY09 (Performance Period October 1, 2009 to January 31, 2012): Risk management assessment, strategic plan, metrics and evaluation: \$50,000.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): The purchase of equipment will be made in accordance with the City's Emerging and Small Business Development program requirements.

BACKGROUND

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to accept SHSGP funding in the amount of \$563,187.
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is hereby authorized to establish an operating grant project for the SHSGP Program (#G11009300, #G11009310, #G11009320, #G11009330).
- Section 3. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is hereby authorized to adjust the necessary grant revenue and expenditure budgets (#G11009300, #G11009310, #G11009320, #G11009330) to implement the SHSGP Grant for the amount of \$563,187.

Section 4. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to participate in the Federal Public Safety Procurement Program (PSPP) (also known as the Certified 1122 Program through California Emergency Management Agency [CalEMA]).
