Description/Analysis

Issue: The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) has been allotted an amount not to exceed \$359,938, from the State of California, CalEMA for GVS programming from July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012. The SPD proposes to use this funding to support a comprehensive, cohesive, strategic, and tactical plan to effectively address many of the issues associated with, or contributing to, gang involvement and violent criminal activities. The SPD will partner with the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento Unified School District, Another Choice, Another Chance, and La Familia to implement program objectives. The funding will also provide necessary training for SPD personnel.

Policy Considerations: The acceptance of State funding is consistent with past practices of utilizing State funding to enhance law enforcement operations. In addition, City Council Resolution #2011-391 requires City Council approval to accept grant funding, establish a grant project, and appropriate funding when the grant award is in excess of \$100,000.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): This proposal does not constitute a "project" and is therefore exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act according to CEQA guidelines Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15378(a).

Sustainability Considerations: There are no sustainability considerations associated with this report.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: Over the past several years, the partners involved in implementing this GVS project have created a comprehensive and cohesive strategic and tactical plan to effectively address many of the issues associated with, or contributing to, gang involvement and violent criminal activities. This funding will allow the continuation of this effort and continue to address gang problems in the target area.

Financial Considerations: The total GVS grant allotment is an amount not to exceed \$359,938 and requires a 10% match of \$35,997. SPD will partner with the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento Unified School District, Another Choice, Another Chance, and La Familia to implement program objectives. The program partners will be allotted \$270,000 of the grant funding and be required to fund the match of \$27,000. The SPD's portion of the allocation is \$89,968 and will require a match of \$8,997. SPD's allotment will provide continued funding for one police officer position and training related to GVS. The SPD match will be paid for out of existing resources in the SPD operating budget. This grant will not impact the General Fund.

GANG VIOLENCE SUPPRESSION GRANT

- A. The City of Sacramento, Sacramento Police Department (SPD) has been allotted \$359,938 through the State of California Emergency Agency (CalEMA) to fund Gang Violence Suppression programming from July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012.
- B. The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) proposes to use the \$359,938 allotment to support a comprehensive, cohesive, strategic, and tactical plan to effectively address many of the issues associated with, or contributing to, gang involvement and violent criminal activities. The SPD will partner with the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento Unified School District, Another Choice, Another Chance, and La Familia to implement program objectives. The funding will also provide necessary training for SPD personnel.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to accept, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, a \$359,938 Gang Violence Suppression Grant from CalEMA.
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to establish a grant project (#G11009800) for the GVS Grant.
- Section 3. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust the necessary revenue and expense budgets in Project #G11009800 to implement the \$359,938 GVS Grant.
- Section 4. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to continue position authority for one police officer to support the GVS grant. If the GVS grant funding is discontinued, this position will be eliminated.
