GANG VIOLENCE SUPPRESSION GRANT

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento, Sacramento Police Department (SPD) has been allotted \$359,938 through the State of California Emergency Agency (CalEMA) to fund Gang Violence Suppression programming from July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012.
- B. The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) proposes to use the \$359,938 allotment to support a comprehensive, cohesive, strategic, and tactical plan to effectively address many of the issues associated with, or contributing to, gang involvement and violent criminal activities. The SPD will partner with the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento Unified School District, Another Choice, Another Chance, and La Familia to implement program objectives. The funding will also provide necessary training for SPD personnel.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to accept, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, a \$359,938 Gang Violence Suppression Grant from CalEMA.
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to establish a grant project (#G11009800) for the GVS Grant.
- Section 3. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust the necessary revenue and expense budgets in Project #G11009800 to implement the \$359,938 GVS Grant.
- Section 4. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to continue position authority for one police officer to support the GVS grant. If the GVS grant funding is discontinued, this position will be eliminated.


