Description/Analysis

Issue: Receive the City Clerk's notice declaring the election of a member to the Retirement Hearing Commission.

Background:

The Retirement Hearing Commission hears issues and appeals relating to the Sacramento City Employees Retirement System (SCERS). The Commission seats five members, two of whom are required to be elected by active members of SCERS.

On November 1, 2011, the City Council received a report advising of the City Clerk's intent to hold an election to fill an expiring term on the Retirement Hearing Commission. A statement of interest period was opened so that active SCERS members could express interest in becoming a candidate. At the close of the statement of interest period on November 17, 2011, only one candidate submitted an interest statement for the one available seat.

As outlined in Resolution 2011-024, when only one candidate submits a statement of interest for a seat, that candidate shall automatically be deemed elected by the City Clerk. The Clerk's Notice of Election is attached as Exhibit A.

In addition, within ten days of the Council receiving this report, any active SCERS members may file an appeal with the City Clerk challenging the election procedures, results, or any other aspect of the election. The appeal period ends on December 23, 2011. If an appeal is filed, the matter will be brought before the City Council for review.
