

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2011-671**

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

December 13, 2011

### **AGREEMENT: FY2011/12 – FY2014 METHODIST HOSPITAL OF SACRAMENTO NEIGHBORHOOD POLICING PROGRAM**

#### **BACKGROUND**

- A. Methodist Hospital of Sacramento (MHS), operated by Catholic Healthcare West, has identified a need to enhance security for the area encompassed by Highway 99, Consumnes River Boulevard, Center Parkway, Arroyo Vista Drive, Grandstaff Drive, Valley Hi Drive, and Wyndham Drive. In 2009, MHS experienced an increase in “disruptive behavior” incidents. The Emergency Department is also contending with a large increase in disturbances, many of which are related to the increase in mentally ill subjects that frequented the emergency room and hospital area. Property crimes, traffic issues, and nuisance issues in general are also of concern.

On November 6, 2010, MHS entered into a partnership with the Sacramento Police Department (City Agreement #2010-1013) and implemented a Neighborhood Policing Program at the hospital campus and the surrounding areas.

- B. Police officers assigned to this detail provide neighborhood policing services that include responding to disturbances and emergency calls, addressing crime and nuisance issues using the problem solving philosophy, pertinent safety training, ongoing Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) reviews, and timely investigative follow-up.
- C. The current agreement (City Agreement #2010-1013) with MHS expired on November 6, 2011. MHS has requested to enter into a new agreement, to continue police services for a two-year six month period, beginning January 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2014. The terms of a new multi-year agreement were not finalized prior to the expiration date of the existing contract. In order to continue services while the terms were being finalized an interim agreement was entered into covering the services from November 6, 2011 through December 31, 2011.

#### **BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager’s designee, is authorized to execute a two-year, six-month agreement with MHS to continue the provision of neighborhood police services from January 1, 2012 through June 30, 2014, for a total not to exceed amount of \$525,952.
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager’s designee, is authorized to establish a project (#E11006200) for MHS neighborhood police services.

- Section 3. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to increase the necessary project (#E11006200) revenue and expense budgets up to \$525,952 to implement the agreement with MHS.
- Section 4. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to maintain two (2.00) existing police officer positions assigned to provide services to MHS. These two (2.00) police officer positions will be inactivated if the agreement is terminated.
- Section 5. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust project (#E11006200) revenue and expense budgets based on actual services rendered to MHS.


