Description/Analysis

Issue: The Sacramento Fire Department is seeking approval to accept additional grant funding in the amount of \$56,731 for the 2010 State of California Homeland Security Grant Program (“SHSGP”). This additional funding will be used to replace the fire department’s Hazardous Material (“HAZMAT”) robot. The Council previously approved the Fire department to accept \$408,183 under Resolution No. 2011-252 for the 2010 SHSGP funding period. If approved, this will increase the total amount awarded and accepted to \$464,914 for the 2010 grant period. This additional funding is available through de-obligated 2010 monies previously awarded to other agencies and in response to an identified reduction in grant-funded equipment in the 2011 SHSGP period.

Policy Considerations: Acceptance of SHSGP funding is consistent with City Council action relative to state and federal grant awards. These grant funds will allow the City of Sacramento and the region to benefit from higher level trained personnel.

Environmental Considerations: Under the California Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) guidelines Section 15378, continuing administrative activities do not constitute a project and are therefore exempt from review.

Sustainability: There are no sustainability considerations applicable to the acceptance of SHSGP funding.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: These grant funds will provide a necessary and advanced resource that will help sustain and enhance the response capabilities for the Sacramento region during an emergency situation.

Financial Considerations: There is no obligation on the part of the City for matching funds under the SHSGP grant and there is no impact to the General Fund. The total additional grant award is \$56,731 for a total 2010 grant period award of \$464,914 for the SHSGP Grant (G12902000).

The purchase of a HAZMAT Robot is funded at \$56,731. This robot will be used in the region to enhance the ability of the HAZMAT responders to operate in catastrophic response and recovery incidents.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): Purchase of supplies and equipment will be made in accordance with the City’s Emerging and Small Business Development program requirements.



Background

The United States Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”), Federal Emergency Management Agency (“FEMA”), allocated funding to the Sacramento Office of Emergency Operations through the State of California Homeland Security Grant Program (“SHSGP”). The purpose of this grant is to assist local governments to prepare for emergency situations.

As a sub-recipient to the Sacramento Office of Emergency Operations for this grant, and under Resolution No. 2011-252, the Sacramento Fire Department has accepted \$408,183 in 2010 SHSGP funds. The Sacramento Fire Department is seeking approval to accept additional grant funding in the amount of \$56,731 in 2010 SHSGP funds. If approved, this will increase the total amount awarded and accepted to \$464,914 for the 2010 period. This additional funding is available through de-obligated 2010 monies previously awarded to other agencies and in response to an identified reduction in grant-funded equipment in the 2011 SHSGP period. The additional funds will be used on the following project:

- **Hazardous Materials (“HAZMAT”) Robot**

This project is for the purchase of a HAZMAT / Chemical, Biological, Radiological Nuclear Explosive (“CBRNE”) response robot to be used within the Sacramento Operational Area. The Sacramento Fire Department currently operates one of two Type-1 Hazmat Robots in the Sacramento region. The funding will be used to purchase a replacement robot used for down range CBRNE detection. This robot will replace a robot damaged during the 2010 Arden Way hostage incident while being used in support of an operational area law enforcement agency. The purchase of the robot will help enhance protection of critical infrastructure and key resources, and enhance catastrophic incident planning, response and recovery.

ACCEPTANCE OF ADDITIONAL FUNDING FROM 2010 STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (“SHSGP”).

BACKGROUND

- A. Under Resolution No. 2011-252, Council approved the Sacramento Fire Department to accept \$408,183 in grant funding through the 2010 State Homeland Security Grant Program (“SHSGP”) from the State of California Office of Homeland Security and sub-granted through the County of Sacramento Office of Emergency Operations.
- B. The Sacramento Fire Department is seeking approval to accept additional grant funding from the State of California Office of Homeland Security and sub-granted through the County of Sacramento Office of Emergency Services in the amount of \$56,731 through the 2010 SHSGP. If approved, this will increase the total amount awarded and accepted to \$464,914 for the 2010 grant period.
- C. This additional funding is available through de-obligated 2010 monies previously awarded to other agencies and in response to an identified reduction in grant-funded equipment in the 2011 SHSGP period.
- D. The grant funds being made available will provide necessary and advanced training for the region along with necessary supplies and equipment that will help sustain and enhance the response capabilities for the Sacramento region during an emergency situation.
- E. This additional funding will be used to replace the Sacramento Fire Department’s damaged Hazardous Material (“HAZMAT”) robot.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager or his designees, Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief, are individually authorized to accept an additional \$56,731 in grant funding from the 2010 State Homeland Security Grant Program (“SHSGP”).
- Section 2. The City Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized to adjust the necessary grant revenue and expenditure budgets to increase the budget by \$56,731 to the new total of \$464,914 and implement the SHSGP grant.
- Section 3. The City Manager, or his designee, Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief, is hereby authorized to approve all other paperwork to implement the

additional 2010 SHSGP grant funding awarded and to assure adherence to all grant regulations.
