Description/Analysis

Issue: The Sacramento Fire Department is seeking approval to accept additional grant funding in the amount of \$75,000 from the 2010 State of California Homeland Security Grant Program (“SHSGP”). This additional funding will be used to purchase Nerve Agent Antidote Kits for the fire department. This medication is for the treatment against nerve agents that may be used in Weapons of Mass Destruction (“WMD”) incidents.

Under Resolution No. 2011-252, the Council approved the fire department to accept \$408,183 for the 2010 SHSGP funding period. On January 10, 2012 under Resolution No. 2012-005, Council approved the fire department to accept an additional \$56,731 for the 2010 SHSGP funding period for the purchase of a Hazardous Material robot.

If this proposed resolution is approved, this will increase the total amount awarded and accepted to \$539,914 for the 2010 grant period. This additional funding is available through de-obligated 2010 monies previously awarded to other agencies.

Policy Considerations: Acceptance of SHSGP funding is consistent with City Council action relative to state and federal grant awards. These grant funds will allow the City of Sacramento and the region to benefit by having treatment available in case of a WMD incident involving nerve agents.

Environmental Considerations: Under the California Environmental Quality Act (“CEQA”) guidelines Section 15378, continuing administrative activities do not constitute a project and are therefore exempt from review.

Sustainability: There are no sustainability considerations applicable to the acceptance of SHSGP funding.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: These grant funds will provide a necessary and advanced resource that will help sustain and enhance the response capabilities for the Sacramento region during an emergency situation.

Financial Considerations: There is no obligation on the part of the City for matching funds under the SHSGP grant and there is no impact to the General Fund. The total additional grant award is \$75,000 for a total 2010 grant period award of \$539,914 for the SHSGP grant (G12902000).

The purchase of Nerve Agent Antidote Kits is funded at \$75,000. The kits will be used in the region to treat first responders and the public during WMD incidents involving nerve agents.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): Purchase of supplies and equipment will be made in accordance with the City’s Emerging and Small Business Development program requirements.

Background

The United States Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”), Federal Emergency Management Agency (“FEMA”), allocated funding to the Sacramento Office of Emergency Operations through the State of California Homeland Security Grant Program (“SHSGP”). The purpose of this grant is to assist local governments to prepare for emergency situations.

As a sub-recipient to the Sacramento Office of Emergency Operations for this grant, and under Resolution No. 2011-252, the Sacramento Fire Department has accepted \$408,183 in 2010 SHSGP funds. On January 10, 2012 under Resolution No. 2012-005, Council approved the fire department to accept an additional \$56,731 for the 2010 SHSGP funding period for the purchase of a Hazardous Material robot.

The Sacramento Fire Department is seeking approval to accept additional grant funding in the amount of \$75,000 in 2010 SHSGP funds. If approved, this will increase the total amount awarded and accepted to \$539,914 for the 2010 period. This additional funding is available through de-obligated 2010 monies previously awarded to other agencies. The additional funds will be used on the following project:

- **Nerve Agent Antidote Kits**

This project is for the purchase of Nerve Agent Antidote Kits; specifically the Duodote (atropine and pralidoxime chloride injection) Auto-Injector Kits. These kits will be used within the Sacramento Operational Area for the treatment against nerve agents that may be used in Weapons of Mass Destruction (“WMD”) incidents. The purchase of these kits will help enhance treatment of first responders and the public during these emergency situations.

ACCEPTANCE OF ADDITIONAL FUNDING FROM 2010 STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (“SHSGP”)

BACKGROUND

- A. Under Resolution No. 2011-252, Council approved the Sacramento Fire Department to accept \$408,183 in grant funding through the 2010 State Homeland Security Grant Program (“SHSGP”) from the State of California Office of Homeland Security and sub-granted through the County of Sacramento Office of Emergency Operations.
- B. On January 10, 2012 under Resolution No. 2012-005, Council approved the fire department to accept an additional \$56,731 for the 2010 SHSGP funding period for the purchase of a Hazardous Material robot.
- C. The Sacramento Fire Department is seeking approval to accept additional grant funding from the State of California Office of Homeland Security and sub-granted through the County of Sacramento Office of Emergency Services in the amount of \$75,000 through the 2010 SHSGP. If approved, this will increase the total amount awarded and accepted to \$539,914 for the 2010 grant period.
- D. This additional funding is available through de-obligated 2010 monies previously awarded to other agencies.
- E. The grant funds being made available will provide Nerve Agent Antidote Kits that will help sustain and enhance the response capabilities for the Sacramento region during an emergency situation. This medication is for the treatment against nerve agents that may be used in Weapons of Mass Destruction (“WMD”) incidents.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager or his designees, Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief, are individually authorized to accept an additional \$75,000 in grant funding from the 2010 State Homeland Security Grant Program (“SHSGP”).
- Section 2. The City Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized to adjust the necessary grant revenue and expenditure budgets to increase the budget by \$75,000 to the new total of \$539,914 and implement the SHSGP grant.
- Section 3. The City Manager, or his designee, Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief, is

herby authorized to approve all other paperwork to implement the additional 2010 SHSGP grant funding awarded and to assure adherence to all grant regulations.
