Description/Analysis

Issue: The Department of General Services, Fleet Management division has received a request from the Emergency Vehicle Operations Course (EVOC) to donate a 2002 Dodge Ram truck (equipment number 9508) for use at the EVOC training facility.

Policy Considerations: In accordance with City Code Section 3.80.030(F), surplus property may be donated to any other public agency or charitable organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, by resolution of the City Council. EVOC is a public agency, Joint Powers Authority (JPA) working in conjunction with the County of Sacramento.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA):

The recommendation in this report has been determined to be exempt from the requirements of CEQA, under Section 15061(b)(3) which states that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. The recommendation in this report involves only the donation of a surplus City vehicle for use by a JPA. Therefore, as determined by the City's Environmental Services Planning Manager, no environmental review is necessary.

Sustainability: Not applicable

Commission/Committee Action: Not applicable

Rationale for Recommendation: The Department of General Services, Fleet Management division has received a request from EVOC to donate a 2002 Dodge Ram truck (equipment number 9508) for use at the EVOC training facility. This vehicle is surplus to the City's needs and, if not donated, would be offered for sale at public auction. Donating the vehicle will benefit both the City and EVOC by providing EVOC with a needed vehicle to support its mission to promote safe driving habits and practices through intensive training.

In the past, the City has donated surplus vehicles to community-based organizations for use in projects intended to contribute positively to the quality of life in the City. Such organizations include the Asian Pacific Community Counseling Organization, Discovery Museum History Center, Sacramento Tree Foundation, InAlliance, Sacramento Cottage Housing, Inc., Historic Old Sacramento Foundation, Volunteers of America, and the Sacramento Drowning Accident Rescue Team.

Financial Considerations: Based on the condition and previous auction sales of similar vehicles, the estimated sales value of the subject vehicle is \$3,175. When surplus fleet equipment is sold, the general rule is that the sales proceeds are returned to the owning fund, which in this case is the General Fund (Fund 1001).
