Description/Analysis

Issue: Through the Association of Bay Area Governments (“**ABAG**”), the Jackson Laboratory, a Maine nonprofit institution, is seeking bond financing in a not to exceed amount of \$75,000,000 (the “**Bonds**”) to refinance bonds issued in 2007 and to finance the acquisition, construction, installation, renovation, rehabilitation, and improvement of real property, facilities, and equipment located at 4910 Raley Boulevard in Council District 2 (the “**Project**”). ABAG will be issuing these bonds, and the City will have no financial obligation. But section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (“**Section 147(f)**”) requires that a public hearing be conducted in the jurisdiction where the Project is located, and ABAG’s representatives have requested that the City hold a public hearing as required.

Policy Considerations: ABAG, on behalf of the Jackson Laboratory, represents that it is legally authorized and empowered to undertake this financing. The City Attorney’s Office has reviewed the hearing notice and the attached resolution and concluded that the City Council has the legal authority to take the recommended action.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): The proposed council action of a public hearing is exempt from CEQA under section 15378(b) of the CEQA Guidelines.

Economic Impact: Not applicable.

Sustainability: Not applicable.

Commission/Committee Action: Not applicable.

Rationale for Recommendation: Under Section 147(f), ABAG may not issue the Bonds, which are private-activity bonds, unless the City approves the issuance after holding a public hearing for which reasonable public notice is given. Accordingly, it is requested that City Council hold the required public hearing regarding the issuance of the Bonds and approve the issuance of the Bonds by ABAG.

Financial Considerations: This Project and associated financing have no fiscal impact to the City. The Bonds will be paid entirely from repayments by the Jackson Laboratory under a loan agreement with ABAG. Neither the full faith and credit nor the taxing power, if any, of the City is pledged to the payment of the principal of, any premium for, or interest on the bonds.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): There are no goods or services being purchased as a direct result of this action.

Background

The Jackson Laboratory is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit institution focused on mammalian genetics research to advance human health. Their mission is to discover the genetic basis for preventing, treating, and curing human disease, and to enable research for the global biomedical community.

In 2007, the Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG) Financing Authority for Nonprofit Corporations issued and made available for sale \$38 million in bonds to the benefit of The Jackson Laboratory, a Maine nonprofit institution.

The proceeds from that bond sale were used to finance (1) the construction, acquisition, installation, renovation, rehabilitation, and improvement of real property, facilities, equipment, and improvements at the research facilities located at 4910 Raley Boulevard, Sacramento, California; and (2) various costs of issuance in connection with the issuance of the bonds.

The Jackson Laboratory has remained in good standing on these bonds. In 2007 it was estimated that the new facility would allow The Jackson Laboratory to expand from 64 skilled workers to 120. Today, The Jackson Laboratory has 133 direct employees and 19 temporary staff (most of whom they plan to hire directly). The 2007 bonds enabled them to expand distribution of their unique mice to researchers across North America.

ABAG intends to issue and sell additional bonds for the benefit of The Jackson Laboratory. To that end, ABAG is requesting that the City hold a required public hearing in accordance with section 147(f) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. Importantly, the City's only responsibility for the new bonds is to hold the mandatory public hearing; the City will have no liability for payment of interest and principal.

These new bonds will be used to refinance the 2007 bonds as well as to finance further improvements of the research facility located at 4910 Raley Boulevard, Sacramento, California. The project includes the fit-out of approximately 34,000 square feet of production and 16,000 square feet of support space. In addition to the interior improvements, core infrastructure will be installed to support operations, including additional boilers, chiller, another emergency generator, autoclaves, cage and bottle washers, and other miscellaneous support equipment. The project will complete the build-out of the second floor of the facility, with the addition of seven holding rooms.

APPROVING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF REVENUE BONDS BY ABAG FINANCE AUTHORITY FOR NONPROFIT CORPORATIONS IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$70,000,000 MILLION TO BENEFIT THE JACKSON LABORATORY

BACKGROUND:

- A. The Jackson Laboratory, a Maine nonprofit institution (the “**Institution**”), has requested that the ABAG Finance Authority For Nonprofit Corporations, a joint-exercise-of-powers agency established under the laws of the State of California (the “**Authority**”), issue and sell its revenue bonds in an aggregate principal amount not expected to exceed \$75,000,000 (the “**Bonds**”) for the purpose of making a loan to the Institution in accordance with the plan of financing and refinancing for certain capital facilities, as more fully described below.
- B. The City of Sacramento (the “**City**”) is a member of the Authority.
- C. The plan is to finance the acquisition, construction, installation, renovation, rehabilitation, and improvement of real property, facilities, equipment, and improvements at the research facilities located at 4910 Raley Boulevard, Sacramento, California (collectively, the “**Project**”); to refinance certain existing debt issued in 2007 relating to the Project; and to finance various costs of issuance, debt-service reserves, capitalized interest, related working capital, and credit-enhancement fees in connection with the issuance of the Bonds. The Project is owned and operated by the Institution or an affiliated entity and used for research purposes.
- D. The interest on the Bonds may qualify for tax exemption under section 103 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the “**Code**”), only if the Bonds are approved in accordance with section 147(f) of the Code.
- E. The Sacramento City Council (the “**City Council**”) is the elected legislative body of the City and as such is the “applicable elected representative” of the City for purposes of section 147(f) of the Code.
- F. The Authority has requested that the City Council approve the issuance and sale of the Bonds in order to satisfy the public-approval requirements of section 147(f) of the Code.
- G. The Project is located wholly within the City.

- H. On September 12, 2012, the City caused a notice to appear in the *Daily Recorder* and the *Sacramento Bee*, which are newspapers of general circulation in the City, stating that a public hearing with respect to the issuance of the Bonds would be held by the City Council on September 27, 2012.
- I. The City Council held the public hearing described above on September 27, 2012, and an opportunity was provided for persons to comment on the issuance and sale of the Bonds and on the plan of financing and refinancing of the Project.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council hereby finds that the statements set out in paragraphs A through I of the Background are true.

Section 2. The City Council hereby approves the issuance and sale of the Bonds by the Authority. The City Council intends that this resolution constitute approval of the Bonds by the applicable elected representative of the governmental unit having jurisdiction over the area in which the Project is located, as required by section 147(f) of the Code.

Section 3. The City Council's approval of the issuance and sale of the Bonds is neither an approval of the underlying credit issues of the proposed Project nor an approval of the financial structure of the Bonds.

The State Board of Equalization requires that a person who sells pets must register with the Board for a seller's permit if they are engaged in business in California and make more than two sales during a twelve-month period. The number of sales is measured by each individual sale of an animal, not by the number of litters.

Sacramento City and County have established ordinances regarding animal licensing. The code states: It is unlawful for any person to own, harbor or keep a dog or cat, over the age of four months, without first obtaining a license authorizing the keeping of such dog or cat. It is unlawful for any person to breed an unaltered dog or cat while the dog or cat is unlicensed. It is unlawful for any person to own, harbor or keep any dog or cat over the age of four months that has not been sterilized, unless such person holds an unaltered license, unaltered license with reduced fees, or is otherwise exempt. Any owner who advertises any dog or cat for sale shall display the license number in any such advertisement. If selling a litter of kittens and/or puppies under the age of four months, the license number of the animal who was bred must be displayed.
