

## **RESOLUTION NO. 2012-411**

Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

December 11, 2012

### **Agreement: 2013 Kaiser Foundation Hospital, d/b/a Kaiser Permanente South Sacramento Hospital, Neighborhood Policing Program**

#### **BACKGROUND**

- A. The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) has been in agreement with Kaiser Foundation Hospital (KFH) since 1997 (Agreement #97-002) to promote and enhance Community Oriented Policing programs in the area of Valley Hi Drive and Wyndham Drive, and the Orangewood East and West Apartments. The agreement provides funding for 2.0 Police Officer Full Time Equivalent (FTE) positions.
- B. Police officers assigned to this detail provide neighborhood policing services that include responding to disturbances and emergency calls, addressing crime and nuisance issues using the problem solving philosophy, pertinent safety training, ongoing Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) reviews, and timely investigative follow-up.
- C. The current agreement (Agreement #2012-092) is the twelfth amendment to the Neighborhood Policing Grant with KFH and is set to expire on December 31, 2012. KFH has requested to enter into a new agreement to continue police services for a one-year period, beginning January 1, 2013 and ending December 31, 2013.

#### **BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to execute a one-year agreement with KFH to continue the provision of neighborhood police services from January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013, for a total not to exceed amount of \$215,366.
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust the appropriate Police Department operating expense and revenue budgets to reflect the \$215,366 agreement with KFH.
- Section 4. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to maintain two (2.00) currently existing Police Officer FTE positions. These two (2.00) police officer FTE positions will be inactivated if funding is reduced or the agreement is terminated.

Section 5. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust Police Department operating revenue and expense budgets based on actual services rendered to KFH on an annual basis.


