## Description/Analysis

**Issue:** The west side of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, between O and P Streets, is located directly across from the Crocker Art Museum (see Exhibit A). Currently, parking on that section of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street is unregulated, so vehicles park in those spaces for extended periods of time making them unavailable to visitors of the museum.

**Policy Considerations:** This recommendation is consistent with the City's strategic plan and the goal of the City Council to achieve sustainability and enhance livability.

### Environmental Considerations:

**California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA):** The current proposal involves restrictions to parking. The proposal is not a "project" in accordance with Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines. The proposal does not have a potential for resulting in either direct or indirect physical changes in the environment. Therefore, as determined by the City's Environmental Services Planning Manager, no environmental review is necessary.

**Sustainability Considerations:** This action supports the City of Sacramento's sustainability goals to improve and optimize the transportation infrastructure.

**Other:** None.

**Commission/Committee Action:** None.

**Rationale for Recommendation:** Parking on the west side of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, between O and P Streets (see Exhibit A), is currently unregulated and often occupied by vehicles for extended periods of time. Regulating parking on the west side of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street with "Two Hour Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays" will allow visitors to park near Crocker Art Museum.

In response to Crocker Art Museum's request, a parking occupancy study was conducted between October 16 and October 18, 2012, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. It was determined that the average parking occupancy (61%) was sufficient enough to adversely impact the business.

A vote was not conducted for this request as there is only one property owner.

**Financial Considerations:** The cost to implement the recommended parking regulation is estimated to be \$390. There are sufficient General Funds (Fund 1001) in the Parking Services Division operating budget to implement this recommendation.

**Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD):** Any goods or services will be purchased in accordance with established City policy.



## **Background Information**

Parking Lots X and Y, located north and west, respectively, of Crocker Park, provide customer and employee parking for the Crocker Art Museum.

The west side of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, between O and P Streets, is located directly across from the Crocker Art Museum. Currently, parking on that section of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street is unregulated, so vehicles often park in those spaces for long periods of time making them unavailable to visitors of the museum. Regulating parking on the west side of 2nd Street with “Two-Hour Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays” will allow customers to park near Crocker Art Museum.

In response to Crocker Art Museum’s request, a parking occupancy study was conducted between October 16 and October 18, 2012 during 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. It was determined that the average parking occupancy (61%) was sufficient enough to adversely impact the business.

A vote was not conducted for this request as there is only one property owner.

There are 25 parking spaces along the proposed section of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street.

### PROPOSED TWO HOUR PARKING RESTRICTIONS FOR A SECTION OF 2ND STREET

#### BACKGROUND

- A. Parking on the west side of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, between O and P Streets, is currently unregulated and often occupied by vehicles for extended periods of time. Regulating parking on the west side of 2<sup>nd</sup> Street with “Two-Hour Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays” will allow customers to park near Crocker Art Museum.
- B. In response to Crocker Art Museum’s request, a parking occupancy study was conducted between October 16 and October 18, 2012, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. It was determined that the average parking occupancy (61%) was sufficient enough to adversely impact the business.
- C. A vote was not conducted for this request as there is only one property owner.
- D. There is sufficient funding within the Parking Services Division’s FY2012/13 General Fund operating budget to implement the recommended parking regulation.

#### BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The following street will be regulated with “Two Hour Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays”:
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, west side, between O and P Streets.
