Description/Analysis

Issue: Parking along the west side of 4th Street, between J Street and the J/K alley (See Exhibit A) is currently regulated with 30 minute parking, limiting the time customers have to patronize neighboring businesses.

Policy Considerations: This recommendation is consistent with the City's strategic plan and the goal of the City Council to achieve sustainability and enhance livability.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): The current proposal involves restrictions to parking. The proposal is not a "project" in accordance with Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines. The proposal does not have a potential for resulting in either direct or indirect physical changes in the environment. Therefore, as determined by the City's Environmental Services Planning Manager, no environmental review is necessary.

Sustainability Considerations: This action supports the City of Sacramento's sustainability goals to improve and optimize the transportation infrastructure.

Other: None.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: Modifying parking on the proposed section of 4th Street (See Exhibit A) from "30 Minute Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays" to "One Hour Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays" will give customers adequate time to visit neighboring businesses.

A vote was not conducted for this request as there is only one property owner.

Financial Considerations: The cost to implement the recommended parking regulation is estimated to be \$152. Sufficient General Funds (Fund 1001) are available in the Parking Services Division operating budget to implement this recommendation.

- C. There is sufficient funding within the Parking Division’s FY2012/13 operating budget to implement the recommended parking regulation.


BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 4th Street, west side, from J Street to the J/K alley.




EXHIBIT A
