Description/Analysis

Issue: Resolution 2013-0004 was adopted by the City Council on January 3, 2013 to regulate parking on the west side of 2nd Street between O and P Streets (Exhibit A) with “Two-Hour Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays.” There was a typographical error in the adopted resolution and it should have read “Three-Hour Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays.”

Policy Considerations: Not applicable.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): The current proposal involves restrictions to parking. The proposal is not a “project” in accordance with Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines. The proposal does not have a potential for resulting in either direct or indirect physical changes in the environment. Therefore, as determined by the City’s Environmental services Planning Manager, no environmental review is necessary.

Sustainability Considerations: This action supports the City of Sacramento’s sustainability goals to improve and optimize the transportation infrastructure.

Other: Not applicable.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: The west side of 2nd Street, between O and P Streets (Exhibit A) is located directly across from the Crocker Art Museum. Parking on that section of 2nd Street was unregulated, so vehicles often parked in those spaces for long periods of time making them unavailable to visitors of the museum.

Resolution 2013-0004 was adopted by the City Council on January 3, 2013 to regulate parking on the west side of 2nd Street between O and P Streets with “Two-Hour Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays.” A typographical error in the adopted resolution was subsequently identified and it should have read “Three-Hour Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays.” The Crocker Art Museum originally requested a three-hour parking limit to provide visitors sufficient time to visit the museum.

Background Information

City parking lots X and Y, located north and west, respectively, of Crocker Park, provide customer and employee parking for the Crocker Art Museum.

The west side of 2nd Street, between O and P Streets, is located directly across from the Crocker Art Museum. Parking on that section of 2nd Street was unregulated, so vehicles often parked in those spaces for long periods of time making them unavailable to visitors of the museum.

In response to Crocker Art Museum staff's request, a parking occupancy study was conducted between October 16 and October 18, 2012, during 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. It was determined that the average parking occupancy (61%) was sufficient enough to adversely impact the business. The results of the parking study led to the adoption of Resolution 2013-0004 by the City Council establishing the current parking regulation of "Two-Hour Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays."

A typographical error in the adopted resolution was subsequently identified and it should have read "Three-Hour Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays." The Crocker Art Museum originally requested a three-hour parking limit to provide visitors sufficient time to visit the museum.

There are 25 parking spaces along the proposed section of 2nd Street.

BACKGROUND


- A. The west side of 2nd Street, between O and P Streets, is located directly across from the Crocker Art Museum. Parking on that section of 2nd Street was unregulated, so vehicles often parked in those spaces for long periods of time making them unavailable to visitors of the museum.
- B. On January 3, 2013, City Council approved Resolution 2013-0004 regulating parking on the west side of 2nd Street with “Two-Hour parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays.”
- C. Due to a typographical error, the parking regulation approved under Resolution 2013-0004 was incorrect and should have read “Three-Hour parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays.” Crocker Museum staff originally requested three-hour parking limits to provide visitors sufficient time to visit the museum.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The following street will be regulated with “Three-Hour parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Excluding Sundays.”
 - 2nd Street, west side, between O and P Streets.
- Section 2. Resolution 2013-0004 is repealed.
