APPROVING MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN CITY OF SACRAMENTO AND CITY OF CITRUS HEIGHTS FOR PARTICIPATION AT THE CITY'S PERMANENT HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION FACILITY

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento operates a Permanent Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility (PHHWCF), located at the Sacramento Recycling and Transfer Station, 8491 Fruitridge Road. This facility provides a convenient drop-off location for recycling and disposal of household hazardous waste (e.g., antifreeze, batteries, bulbs, oil, paint) by City residents. The PHHWCF also serves as a regional facility through Memorandums of Understanding (MOU's) for residents of Elk Grove, Rancho Cordova, and Sacramento County. The recommended MOU will expand this regional use to include the City of Citrus Heights.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1 The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is hereby authorized to execute a MOU with the City of Citrus Heights to allow Citrus Heights residents to bring household hazardous waste to the City of Sacramento's PHHWCF.
- Section 2 Exhibit A is part of this Resolution.


