**Title: Grant: Gang Violence Suppression**

**Location:** Citywide

**Issue:** Acceptance of the Gang Violence Suppression grant will allow the Sacramento Police Department to continue to work in collaboration with its partners to address gang violence issues in the City.

**Recommendation:** Pass a Resolution 1) authorizing the City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, to accept on behalf of the City of Sacramento a \$362,000 Gang Violence Suppression (GVS) grant from the State of California, Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC); 2) authorizing the City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, to establish a GVS grant project (G11010900); 3) authorizing the City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, to adjust the necessary grant revenue and expense budgets in project G11010900 to implement the \$362,000 grant; 4) authorizing the City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, to adjust the necessary grant revenue and expense budgets in project G11010900 to implement the required GVS match of \$36,200; and 5) authorizing the City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, to continue position authority for one Police Officer position to support the GVS grant.

## Description/Analysis

**Issue:** The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) has been allotted \$362,000 from the State of California, Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) for Gang Violence Suppression (GVS) programming. The SPD proposes to use this funding to support a comprehensive, cohesive, strategic, and tactical plan to effectively address many of the issues associated with, or contributing to, gang involvement and violent criminal activities. The SPD will partner with the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento Unified School District, Another Choice, Another Chance, and La Familia to implement program objectives. The funding will also provide necessary training and equipment for the SPD.

**Policy Considerations:** Accepting state funding is consistent with past practices of using state funding to enhance law enforcement operations. City Council Resolution 2012-185 requires City Council approval to accept grant funding, establish a grant project, and appropriate funding when the grant award is in excess of \$100,000.

**Economic Impact:** None.

### Environmental Considerations:

**California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA):** This proposal does not constitute a "project" and is therefore exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act according to CEQA guidelines Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15378(a).

**Sustainability Considerations:** There are no sustainability considerations associated with this report.

**Commission/Committee Action:** None.

**Rationale for Recommendation:** Over the past several years, the partners involved in implementing this GVS project have created a comprehensive and cohesive strategic and tactical plan to effectively address many of the issues associated with, or contributing to, gang involvement and violent criminal activities. This funding will allow the continuation of this effort and continue to address gang problems.

**Financial Considerations:** The total GVS grant allotment is an amount not to exceed \$362,000 and requires a 10% match of \$36,200. The SPD will partner with the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento Unified School District, Another Choice, Another Chance, and La Familia to implement program objectives. The program partners will be allotted \$223,000 of the grant funding and be required to fund the match of \$22,300. The SPD's portion of the allocation is \$139,000 and will require a match of \$13,900. The SPD's allotment will provide continued funding for one Police Officer position and GVS related training and equipment. The SPD

match will be paid for out of SPD General Fund resources. This grant will not impact the General Fund.

### **GANG VIOLENCE SUPPRESSION GRANT**

#### **BACKGROUND**

- A. The City of Sacramento, Sacramento Police Department (SPD) has been allotted \$362,000 through the State of California, Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC), to fund Gang Violence Suppression (GVS) programming. This grant requires a 10 percent match of \$36,200.
- B. The Sacramento Police Department (SPD) proposes to use the \$362,000 allotment to support a comprehensive, cohesive, strategic, and tactical plan to effectively address many of the issues associated with, or contributing to, gang involvement and violent criminal activities.
- C. The SPD will partner with the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Sacramento County Probation Department, Sacramento Unified School District, Another Choice, Another Chance, and La Familia to implement program objectives. The program partners will be allotted \$223,000 and will be required to fund a match of \$22,300.
- D. The SPD's portion of the allocation is \$139,000 and will require a match of \$13,900. The SPD's allotment will provide continued funding for one Police Officer position and GVS related equipment and training. The SPD match will be paid for out of existing resources in the SPD operating budget.

#### **BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to accept, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, a \$362,000 Gang Violence Suppression grant from BSCC.
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to establish a grant project (G11010900) for the GVS grant.
- Section 3. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust the necessary revenue and expense budgets in project G11010900 to implement the \$362,000 GVS grant.
- Section 4. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust the necessary revenue and expense budgets in project G110010900 to implement the required GVS match of \$36,200.

Section 5. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to continue position authority for one Police Officer to support the GVS grant. If the GVS grant funding is discontinued the position will be eliminated.
