**Title:** Grant: Vessel Turn-In Program

**Location:** Citywide

**Issue:** On July 2, 2013, the California Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) awarded a \$4,000 grant to the Sacramento Police Department (SPD) for the creation and administration of a Vessel Turn-In Program (VTIP). This grant requires matching funds. City Council Resolution 2013-0198, Section 11.1(1)(b), requires City Council approval to establish a grant that requires matching funds from City resources.

**Recommendation:** Pass a Resolution 1) authorizing the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, to accept a \$4,000 Vessel Turn-In Program (VTIP) grant award from the DBW; 2) authorizing the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, to establish a grant project (G11011700) for the VTIP; 3) authorizing the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, to adjust the appropriate grant revenue and expense budgets in the VTIP grant (G11011700) by \$4,000 to implement the award; and 4) authorizing the City Manager or the City Manager's designee, to transfer matching funds in the amount of \$400 from the SPD General Fund operating budget to the VTIP grant (G11011700).

## Description/Analysis

**Issue:** On July 2, 2013, the California Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) awarded a \$4,000 grant to the Sacramento Police Department (SPD) for the creation and administration of a Vessel Turn-In Program (VTIP). The program will provide an alternative for boat owners to surrender unwanted recreational vessels to the SPD, instead of abandoning their vessels on public waterways. The VTIP was established by Assembly Bill 166 (Chapter 416, Statutes 2009) and became effective January 1, 2010. The program provides grants to local public agencies to administer turn-in programs in their jurisdictions. Funding for the VTIP comes from the state Abandoned Watercraft Abatement Fund (AWAF).

**Policy Considerations:** City Council Resolution 2013-0198, Section 11.1(1)(b), requires City Council approval to establish a grant that requires matching funds from City resources. In addition, Section 11.3 of the Resolution requires City Council approval to establish a grant when such action is a grantor funding condition.

**Economic Impact:** None.

**Environmental Considerations:** Not applicable.

**California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA):** This proposal does not constitute a “project” and is therefore exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) according CEQA guidelines, found in the California Code of Regulations Title 14, Sections 15061(b)(3) and 15378(a).

**Sustainability Considerations:** Not applicable.

**Commission/Committee Action:** Not applicable.

**Rationale for Recommendation:** Authorizing the acceptance of the VTIP grant award will allow the SPD to provide an alternative for boat owners to surrender unwanted recreational vessels in lieu of abandonment.

**Financial Considerations:** The total VTIP grant award is \$4,000. The grant has a ten percent, or \$400, match requirement. The match will be funded out of existing resources within the SPD’s Fiscal Year 2013/14 General Fund operating budget.

### **GRANT: VESSEL TURN IN PROGRAM (VTIP)**

#### **BACKGROUND**

- A. On July 2, 2013, the California Division of Boating and Waterways (DBW) awarded a \$4,000 grant to the Sacramento Police Department (SPD) for the creation and administration of a Vessel Turn-In Program (VTIP). The VTIP program will provide an alternative for boat owners to surrender unwanted recreational vessels to the SPD, instead of abandoning their vessels on public waterways. The VTIP grant requires a ten percent, or \$400, matching contribution.

#### **BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to accept a \$4,000 Vessel Turn-In Program (VTIP) grant award from the DBW.
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to establish a grant project (G11011700) for the VTIP.
- Section 3. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust and appropriate the grant revenue and expense budgets by \$4,000 to implement the award.
- Section 4. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to transfer matching funds in the amount of \$400 from the SPD General Fund operating budget to the VTIP grant.
