Title: Agreement: Transfer and Acceptance of Swift Water Equipment from California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES)

Location: Citywide

Issue: Cal OES is transferring swift water equipment and all its related forms and records to the City of Sacramento Fire Department in accordance with the California Fire Service and Rescue Emergency Mutual Aid Plan and as part of the mutual aid response plan for all-risk events, emergency incidents, civil defense and other disasters. The value of the contract can potentially exceed \$200,000 which pursuant to City Code Section 3.56.090 requires contracts of \$100,000 or more to be approved by the City Council.

Recommendation: Pass a Motion authorizing the City Manager or his designees, Interim Fire Chief and Deputy Fire Chief, to execute the agreement for the transfer of swift water equipment to the City of Sacramento Fire Department.

Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: Under the proposed agreement between the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) and the City of Sacramento Fire Department (SFD), Cal OES is transferring a swift water cache package to SFD as part of the California Fire Service and Rescue Emergency Mutual Aid System. Cal OES will be transferring two inflatable rescue boats, a tow vehicle and a trailer as part of the swift water cache package. This transfer is made for the purpose of enhancing SFD's response capabilities in the event of any emergency swift water incidents within the Sacramento region.

Policy Considerations: In pursuant to City Code Section 3.56.090, contracts of \$100,000 or more are to be approved by the City Council.

Economic Impacts: None.

Environmental Considerations: This report concerns administrative activities that will not have a significant effect on the environment, and does not constitute a "project" as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"). See CEQA Guidelines Section 15061 (b) (3); 15378 (b) (2).

Sustainability: There are no sustainability considerations applicable to the transferring of swift water equipment to SFD.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: The acceptance of this equipment will give added support to the department's rescue inventory and enhance the department's response plan to any emergency incidents and disaster that involves swift water rescue operations within the region.

Financial Considerations: There are no further financial obligations to the City of Sacramento at the time of transfer of the swift water equipment from Cal OES. Although there is no financial obligation to the City of Sacramento for the transfer of swift water equipment from Cal OES, it is in the proposed agreement that SFD will assume full responsibility for the repair or replacement of equipment, in the event that they are consumed, lost, stolen, damaged or destroyed at the fault of SFD. In this case, the potential cost of the contract can exceed \$200,000.

AGREEMENT FOR

TEMPORARY TRANSFER OF SWIFT WATER EQUIPMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this seventeenth day of December, 2013, by and between the **STATE OF CALIFORNIA** whereas the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) is referenced in this agreement falls under the authority acting by and between its duly appointed and qualified Director of the Cal OES, hereinafter called the "**STATE**," and the city of Sacramento Fire Department, acting by and through its duly appointed, qualified and acting officers, hereinafter called the "**ASSIGNEE**",

WITNESSETH:

IT IS HEREBY MUTUALLY AGREED between the parties hereto as follows:

1. The **STATE** hereby transfers possession to the **ASSIGNEE** and the **ASSIGNEE** hereby accepts possession from the **STATE** of the Swift Water/Flood Rescue (SF-S&R Tow Vehicle and Trailer), and related SF-S&R equipment listed on the attached Exhibit "A" which is by this reference made a part hereof, for the period commencing December 17, 2013 for the following all-risk events, emergency incidents, civil defense and disaster purposes, namely:

Local and/or mutual aid emergency incidents involving flooding due to natural or man-caused events; emergency incidents threatening properties vital to national defense or important military installations; parades and displays; training of regular, volunteer, and auxiliary firefighters; and temporary standby for assignee's water rescue capability or for the water rescue capability of other departments while the assignee's or other department's equipment is out of service for repairs.

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b. Equipment inventories (Exhibit "A") may by mutual concurrence of the **STATE** and the **ASSIGNEE** be changed during the term of this agreement, utilizing property accountability procedures established or approved by the State.

2. Housing, Maintenance, Repair, and Replacement. During the term of this transfer, the **ASSIGNEE** agrees to adequately house in an enclosed secure structure, staff, operate, maintain, and repair (consistent with section 2 b.) said Swift Water/Flood Rescue Cache (SF-S&R Trailer), tow vehicle and related SF-S&R equipment (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Swift Water Cache" except where it is desired to refer to equipment items alone, in which case the term "equipment" is used) at its sole cost and expense, save as otherwise expressly provided in this agreement. The Swift Water Cache shall be housed on property of the **ASSIGNEE** in a manner to provide reasonable protection against inclement weather, sabotage, theft, or malicious damage. The Swift Water Cache shall be maintained in such condition that it is available for immediate emergency use, and at the same standard as other emergency apparatus operated by the **ASSIGNEE**. Maintenance shall include care of hose, batteries, tires, appliances, lubrication and fuel, general cleaning and polishing, minor body repairs, and periodic testing. Repairs shall include, without being limited to, motor tune-ups, and all equipment assigned to the Swift Water Cache and so forth.

a. Repairs to the extent of \$100.00 for each individual item of repair shall be the responsibility of the **ASSIGNEE**.

b. Repairs to the extent that they exceed \$100.00 for each individual item of repair shall be the responsibility of the **STATE** on a \$100.00 deductible basis, unless in the judgment of the **STATE** the same results from misuse or negligence on the part of the **ASSIGNEE** in the maintenance or use of the Swift Water Cache, in which event the cost of each such item of repair above \$100.00 shall also be the responsibility of the **ASSIGNEE**. In no event shall the **ASSIGNEE** arrange for repairs costing above \$100.00 for any item of repair, whether it deems the same to be the responsibility of the **STATE** or the **ASSIGNEE**, without first obtaining authorization in writing from the Cal OES Fire and Rescue Division.

c. All equipment must remain on the trailer and in the location on the trailer as it was delivered to and assigned to the **ASSIGNEE**. The legal GVWR is 9,800 pounds. This GVWR must never be exceeded. The placement of equipment mounted on or in the trailer must NOT be changed. The **ASSIGNEE** shall be liable therefore to the extent for all damages if the GVWR is exceeded and damage results from an accident or overloading.

d. Notwithstanding the foregoing, replacement of batteries and tires shall be the responsibility of the **STATE**, with the exception the **STATE** deems damage thereto to be the result of negligence or misuse on the part of the **ASSIGNEE**, in which event the **ASSIGNEE** will bear such portion of the replacement cost thereof as the **STATE** deems equitable. Procurement of tires and batteries are subject to State fiscal policies and procedures, and written approval must be obtained from the Cal OES Fire and Rescue Division prior to procurement.

e. Maintenance and repairs must be requested and authorized pursuant to the Cal OES Fire and Rescue Division Operations Bulletin #18, which is hereby incorporated into this agreement by reference.

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f. Repair or replacement of the Swift Water Cache transferred hereunder which is consumed, lost, stolen, damaged, or destroyed during mutual aid operations when the STATE has dispatched or directed the dispatch of said Swift Water Cache through Regional or Operational Area Fire and Rescue Coordinators, or when the STATE has reassigned said Swift Water Cache pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 10 of this agreement, shall be the responsibility of the STATE, providing that any such loss or damage is due to the negligence of the ASSIGNEE under such circumstances, the ASSIGNEE shall be liable therefore to the extent that the STATE deems equitable. The ASSIGNEE agrees that it will assume responsibility in full for the repair or replacement of equipment which has been consumed, lost, stolen, damaged, or destroyed in operations other than referred to in this paragraph.

3. Inspection of Swift Water Cache. The ASSIGNEE agrees that representatives of the Cal OES Fire and Rescue Division and other authorized State personnel may inspect the Swift Water Cache at any time.

4. Staffing. Reasonable and continual training shall be carried on so that trained personnel shall at all times be available to staff and operate said Swift Water Cache. The ASSIGNEE shall provide personnel to staff the assigned Swift Water Cache per FIREScope ICS standards. The Swift Water Cache may be assigned to out of area assignments for up to 14 days, plus travel time. When local government personnel staffing the Cal OES Swift Water Cache are committed to extended assignments there may be a need to replace or rotate personnel. Personnel rotation will follow the direction outlined in the California Fire Assistance Agreement when assigned to an incident within California.

5. Training. Personnel assigned shall meet ICS standards established in the California Incident Command Certification System (CICCS) and FIREScope ICS-SF-S&R-020-1 Swift Water/Flood Search and Rescue, Recommended Training, Skills, and Equipment List. Personnel assigned to the Swift Water Cache shall meet Swift Water/Flood Search and Rescue standards as certified by the California State Fire Marshal.

6. Deployment. All movement of the Swift Water Cache shall be handled through the official dispatching channels of the ASSIGNEE. The ASSIGNEE dispatchers will recognize and act on all official requests for movement of the Swift Water Cache in conformance with the Fire and Rescue Annex (California Fire and Rescue Mutual Aid System) to the State Emergency Plan and its subsequent revisions. The STATE reserves the right to dispatch, direct the dispatch of, or temporarily reassign the said Swift Water Cache and equipment whenever, in the opinion of the Secretary of Cal OES, his/her representatives, or Operational Area and Regional Fire and Rescue Coordinators, such Swift Water Cache and equipment is essential to the protection of life and property in another jurisdiction or in the best interest of the STATE.

7. Mutual Aid Response. Procedures for mutual aid response shall be in accordance with California Fire Service and Rescue Emergency Mutual Aid Plan.

8. Reimbursable Response. Reimbursement for mutual aid may be provided pursuant to a governor's disaster proclamation or when conditions warrant invoking the California Fire Assistance Agreement, the Emergency Management Assistance Compact, the State of Nevada Cooperative Agreement, or the Interstate Compact as appropriate. There is no other existing provision for mutual aid reimbursement.

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9. Temporary Use. The ASSIGNEE shall be permitted to use their assigned Swift Water Cache for temporary cover of like resources in a fire station when emergency conditions warrant, or when regular apparatus is out of service for repairs. In either case the ASSIGNEE shall immediately notify the Operational Area Dispatch Center and the Cal OES Fire Duty Chief. The ASSIGNEE further agrees that Cover-in or Standby of said Swift Water Cache exceeding 30 days is at the discretion of the STATE.

10. Temporary Transfer.

a. An assignment of the Swift Water Cache and/or any portion thereof by the ASSIGNEE for any period not exceeding seven consecutive days within a given operational Area may be made with the consent of the Operational Area Fire and Rescue Coordinator and the STATE, providing that at the time such Swift Water Cache is received, such assignee furnish the ASSIGNEE and the STATE a letter to the effect that he assumes all obligations of the ASSIGNEE with respect to such Swift Water Cache under this agreement during the period of assignment, including insurance coverage in accordance with Paragraph 13 or 14, as appropriate. Any assignment by the ASSIGNEE for a period of more than seven consecutive days shall be subject to authorization by the STATE and execution of an "Agreement for the Temporary Transfer of Swift Water Equipment" with the agency requesting the transfer.

b. Whenever the Swift Water Cache is assigned in accordance with the provisions of this paragraph, the regular ASSIGNEE shall be relieved of its obligations under this agreement during such period of assignment.

c. The STATE will complete a written Temporary Cal OES Swift Water Cache Assignment Record, Exhibit "B". The ASSIGNEE will retain one copy, the Temporary Assignee will retain one copy, and the original document will be on file at Cal OES Fire and Rescue Division.

11. Reports and Records. The ASSIGNEE shall maintain daily and monthly reports on the Apparatus Use Report, Cal OES F-101 Form. Written records shall be maintained current for all rope, webbing, dry suits, personal floatation device, and helmets assigned with the Swift Water Cache and shall be inspected annually. Written results of all tests and reports shall be forwarded to the Cal OES Fire and Rescue Division by the end of the calendar year. A recent copy of the tests and reports shall be maintained with the Swift Water Cache.

12. Report of Accidents. The ASSIGNEE shall immediately notify the Cal OES Fire and Rescue Division following any and all accidents involving the Swift Water Cache. It shall be the responsibility of the ASSIGNEE to fill out State Form 270, "Report of Automobile Accident," and file the report with the STATE. A copy of this report shall be retained by the ASSIGNEE and the original and four copies forwarded to the Cal OES Fire and Rescue Division.

13. Insurance Protection. (Non- State Agencies)

a. The ASSIGNEE agrees forthwith to furnish evidence of insurance protecting the legal liability of the ASSIGNEE and the STATE for liability and/or property damage with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence by means of a Certificate of Insurance

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naming the State of California as Additional Insured. Said certificate shall contain an agreement by the insurance company that it will not cancel said policy without 15 days prior written notice to the STATE and that the STATE is not liable for the payment of any premiums or assessments thereon. Said certificate must include the description of the Swift Water Cache including any equipment identification numbers, the Vehicle Identification Number, the state license plate number, and the Cal OES unit number.

b. In the event the ASSIGNEE is self-insured, the ASSIGNEE, in lieu of a certificate of insurance, shall furnish the STATE a written statement of such fact. In such event, the ASSIGNEE agrees to hold the STATE harmless from any personal injury or property damage claims arising out of its maintenance, use, or operation of the Swift Water Cache under the terms of this agreement.

c. Physical damage insurance, including collision coverage and comprehensive coverage, shall be obtained. The STATE will be named as a loss payee. The description of the Swift Water Cache and the necessary amount of insurance required is outlined in attached Exhibit "C", which is by this reference made a part hereof.

14. Insurance Protection. (State Agencies) Any insurance necessary for coverage of the apparatus shall be the sole responsibility of the department having custody of the vehicle. The ASSIGNEE agrees to report apparatus as being under its control to the Insurance Officer, Department of General Services.

15. Termination of Agreement.

a. Either party may terminate this agreement upon 14 days written notice to the other party, or the ASSIGNEE may relinquish, or the STATE may repossess any portion of the Swift Water Cache upon like notice to the other party, except that the STATE may repossess any portion thereof without written notice whenever it deems the same is not being maintained in accordance with this agreement.

b. Upon the termination of this agreement, the ASSIGNEE agrees to return said Swift Water Cache in the same condition as received; reasonable wear and tear, acts of God, and conditions over which the ASSIGNEE has no control excepted.

c. As inventory changes occur, or items of equipment are replaced, deleted, or added by the STATE or replaced by the ASSIGNEE, it is mutually agreed that no amendment to this agreement need be made at the time of the change; provided, however, at the termination of this agreement a complete reconciliation of all equipment will be made. The ASSIGNEE further agrees that all replacements for equipment of the Swift Water Cache will be made with identical or substantially like items as approved by the STATE.

d. Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to create a new property interest or right of action for the ASSIGNEE.

16. Unauthorized Use of the Cal OES Swift Water Cache. Use of this Swift Water Cache other than as specified in paragraph I will be considered a breach of this agreement.

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17. Use of Radio Equipment.

a. The **STATE** will furnish, at the **STATE'S** sole cost, radio equipment installed in the Swift Water Cache to be operated on the following frequencies: 151.145 - 170.925.

b. The **STATE** agrees to maintain said equipment without cost to the **ASSIGNEE**.

c. The **ASSIGNEE** agrees to operate said radio equipment in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Federal Communications Commission.

d. Ownership of said equipment is in the **STATE**, and all applications to the Federal Communications Commission seeking authority to add, modify, or replace radio equipment covered by this agreement shall be made by, and in the name of, the State of California. To activate this agreement, and in compliance with the control requirements of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, the **STATE** hereby deputizes the Chief of the agency of said **ASSIGNEE**, and such volunteers, regularly employed and salaried assistants, as shall be designated by the Chief of the agency as his agents to operate said radio equipment as specified in paragraph "17. c" above.

e. The **STATE** assumes no liability hereunder for claims or losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm, or corporation furnishing or supplying work, services, or material; or services in connection with the performance of this agreement or for any claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm, or corporation injured or damaged by performance of either party hereunder.

18. All notices herein provided to be given, or which may be given by either party to the other shall be deemed to have been fully given when made in writing and deposited in the U.S. mail, registered and postage prepaid and addressed as follows: To the **ASSIGNEE** to the Sacramento Fire Department, 5770 Freeport Boulevard, Suite 200, Sacramento, CA, 95822, and to the **STATE** at California Governor's Office of Emergency Services, Fire and Rescue Division, 3650 Schriever Avenue, Mather, CA, 95655. The address to which notices shall or may be mailed as aforesaid to either party shall or may be changed by written notice given by such party to the other as hereinabove provided; but nothing herein contained shall preclude the giving of any such notice by personal service.

19. It is mutually understood and agreed that no alteration or variation of the terms of this agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties hereto, and that no oral understanding or agreements not incorporated herein, and no alterations or variations of the terms hereof unless made in writing between the parties hereto shall be binding on any of the parties hereto.

20. The **STATE** may, in its sole discretion and for such good cause as it determines, waive in writing in whole or in part any requirement of this agreement that apparatus and/or equipment shall be maintained in operating condition, or repaired, or replaced, providing that any such waiver shall be applicable only to the specific apparatus or equipment to which it refers.

EXHIBIT "C"
INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Part of the agreement through which the STATE makes a temporary transfer of Swift Water Cache is the agreement on the part of the Assignee to furnish certain evidence of insurance. Your organization, as an Assignee of the swift water cache, will want to be mindful of these requirements and assure they are complied with.

Liability Insurance

A certificate of insurance shall be furnished to the STATE providing minimum limits of insurance as follows:

BODILY INJURY and PROPERTY DAMAGE LIABILITY \$1,000,000.00 PER OCCURRENCE

A certificate of insurance will have the following provisions included:

1. The State of California shall be named Additional Insured.
2. The insurance company shall agree that in the event of cancellation, 15 days prior written notice will be given to the STATE.
3. The STATE shall not be responsible for premium or assessments.
4. Certificate of Insurance must include the description of the Swift Water Cache including Vehicle Identification Numbers, State license numbers and the Cal OES unit number.

Physical Damage Insurance

The transfer agreements place certain responsibilities upon your organization for the safekeeping of the swift water cache. The STATE will look to your organization for reimbursement for repair or replacement cost in the event the Swift Water Cache is damaged by misuse or negligence or by other causes, except normal wear and tear, acts of God, and conditions over which your organization has no control.

Physical damage insurance, including collision coverage and comprehensive coverage or combined additional coverage, SHOULD be obtained. The State of California should be named as a loss payee. The description of the Swift Water Cache and the necessary amount of insurance is as follows:
