**Recommendation:** Pass a Resolution authorizing the City Manager, or City Manager's designee, to: 1) accept \$750,316 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-15 Citizen's Option for Public Safety (COPS) program funding from the County of Sacramento; 2) establish an operating grant project (G11012200); 3) establish the necessary operating grant expense and revenue budgets in an amount up to \$750,316; and 4) adjust the necessary operating grant expense and revenue budgets in the FY 2014-15 COPS Project (G11012200), based on actual disbursements received from the County of Sacramento, Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Account (SLESA).

## Description/Analysis

**Issue:** California Government Code sections 30061 to 30063 establish a Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Account (SLESA) in each county treasury for the purpose of the Citizens' Option for Public Safety (COPS) Program and requires monies from this fund to be distributed amongst the cities within each county in accordance with the relative population of each incorporated city. The estimated Fiscal Year (FY) 2014/15 allocation for the City of Sacramento is \$750,316.

**Policy Considerations:** The recommendations contained in this report are consistent with City Council Resolution 2014-0179, which requires City Council approval to establish an operating grant of \$100,000 or more.

**Economic Impact:** None.

**Environmental Considerations:** Not applicable.

**California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA):** This funding is exempt from the CEQA process as it will not cause a direct or indirect physical change in the environment and therefore does not constitute a "project" as defined in CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15061(b)(3), 15378(b)(2) and 21065(b).

**Sustainability Considerations:** Not applicable.

**Commission/Committee Action:** Not applicable.

**Rationale for Recommendation:** COPS Program funding is distributed in accordance with the above referenced sections of the California Government Code. Use of the funds is restricted to those activities which directly support frontline municipal police services. These funds will be utilized to improve operations including the purchase of new safety equipment, replacement of worn equipment, upgrading software, and support for specialized units, such as Air Operations and the Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) team.

**Financial Considerations:** This funding does not require additional resources from the City's General Fund, however funds must be used to supplement, not supplant, existing resources.

**Local Business Enterprise (LBE):** Purchases with this funding will be made in accordance with the City's LBE program, when applicable.

**FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2014/15 CITIZENS' OPTION FOR PUBLIC SAFETY (COPS)  
PROGRAM**

**BACKGROUND**

A. California Government Code sections 30061 to 30063 establishes a Supplemental Law Enforcement Services Account (SLESA) in each county treasury for the purpose of enhancing the efforts of law enforcement jurisdictions to improve frontline law enforcement activities. Each county is responsible for distributing funds from the SLESA amongst each city within the county in accordance with the relative population of each incorporated city.

**BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL  
RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to accept \$750,316 in FY 2014/15 COPS Program funding from the County of Sacramento;
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to establish an operating grant project (G11012200);
- Section 3. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to establish the necessary operating grant expense and revenue budgets up to \$750,316; and
- Section 4. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to adjust the necessary operating grant expense and revenue budgets in the FY2014/15 COPS Program (G11012200), based on actual disbursements received from the County of Sacramento SLESA.
