## Description/Analysis

**Issue:** The County of Sacramento, Office of Emergency Services (SacOES) via the Federal Emergency Management Agency, has awarded the Sacramento Police Department (SPD) \$9,960 in Fiscal Year (FY) 2014 State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP) funds. This funding will be used to provide a single training course that follows the standards set by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) on “Internet Investigations and Training.” The term of the grant program is September 1, 2014 to December 31, 2015.

**Policy Considerations:** The recommendations contained in this report are consistent with City Council Resolution 2014-0179, Section 11, which requires City Council authorization to establish an operating grant regardless of the award amount, when such action is required by the grantor.

**Economic Impact:** None.

**Environmental Considerations:** Not applicable.

**FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2014 STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM (SHSGP) –  
INVESTIGATIONS TRAINING**

**BACKGROUND**

- A. The County of Sacramento, Office of Emergency Services (SacOES) has awarded the Sacramento Police Department (SPD) \$9,960 in FY 2014 SHSGP funding to provide investigative training to SPD staff that follows the standards set by the Department of Homeland Security.

**BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL  
RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- Section 1. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to accept \$9,960 in SHSGP funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), via the County of Sacramento Office of Emergency Services (SacOES);
- Section 2. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to establish an operating grant (G11013400); and
- Section 3. The City Manager, or the City Manager's designee, is authorized to establish the necessary operating grant expense and revenue budgets in an amount not to exceed \$9,960.
