Title: Proposed Parking Time Restriction Changes Near Crocker Park

Location: The west side of 3rd Street between Capitol Mall and P Streets, west side of Front Street between Neasham and O Streets, north side of O Street between 2nd and 3rd Streets, both sides of 2nd Street between N and O Street, and both sides of N Street between 2nd and 3rd Street; District 4

Recommendation: Pass a Resolution 1) regulating parking on a) the west side of 3rd Street between Capitol Mall and O Street, b) the west side of Front Street between Neasham Circle and O Street, and c) both sides of N Street between 2nd and 3rd Streets with "3 Hour Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Excluding Sundays"; and 2) regulating parking on a) the west side of 3rd Street between O and P Streets, b) the north side of O Street between 2nd and 3rd Streets, and c) both sides of 2nd Street between N and O Streets with "90 Minute Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Excluding Sundays".

Description/Analysis

Issue: The proposed locations surrounding Crocker Park are currently occupied with vehicles parking for extended periods of time, making it difficult for Crocker Art Museum guests to find parking.

In response to the business owner's request, a parking occupancy study was conducted between March 24 and March 26, 2015, during 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. It was determined that the average parking occupancy (77%), was sufficient enough to move forward with the proposed parking restrictions.

Policy Considerations: This recommendation supports the Central City Parking Master Plan goal to make parking safe, secure, attractive and convenient.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): The current proposal involves restrictions to parking. The proposal is not a "project" in accordance with Section 15378 of the CEQA Guidelines. The proposal does not have a potential for resulting in either direct or indirect physical changes in the environment. Therefore, as determined by the City's Environmental Services Planning Manager, no environmental review is necessary.

Sustainability Considerations: This action supports the City of Sacramento's sustainability goals to improve and optimize the transportation infrastructure.

Other: None.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: Parking on the proposed locations surrounding Crocker Park (see Exhibit A), is currently regulated with 3 hour and 10 hour parking and is often occupied by vehicles for extended periods of time. Regulating parking on the west side of 3rd Street between Capitol Mall and O Street, the west side of Front Street between Neasham Circle and O Street, and both sides of N Street between 2nd and 3rd Streets with "3 Hour Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Excluding Sundays" and regulating parking on the west side of 3rd Street between O and P Streets, the north side of O Street between 2nd and 3rd Streets, both sides of 2nd Street between N and O Streets with "90 Minute Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Excluding Sundays" will allow short term visitors to find parking spaces near Crocker Art Museum.

A vote was not conducted for this request as there is only one property owner.

Financial Considerations: The cost to implement the recommended parking regulation is estimated to be \$2,700. Sufficient funds are available in the Parking Services Division operating budget (Fund 1001).

Local Business Enterprise Program (LBE): Any goods or services will be purchased in accordance with established City policy.

PROPOSED PARKING TIME RESTRICTION CHANGES NEAR CROCKER PARK

BACKGROUND

- A. Parking on the proposed locations surrounding Crocker Park is currently regulated with 3 and 10 hour parking and is often occupied by vehicles for extended periods of time. Regulating parking on the west side of 3rd Street between Capitol Mall and O Street, the west side of Front Street between Neasham Circle and O Street, and both sides of N Street between 2nd and 3rd Streets with “3 Hour Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Excluding Sundays” and regulating parking on the west side of 3rd Street between O and P Streets, the north side of O Street between 2nd and 3rd Streets, both sides of 2nd Street between N and O Streets with “90 Minute Parking 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Excluding Sundays,” will allow short term customers to find parking spaces near Crocker Art Museum.
- B. In response to the business owner’s request, a parking occupancy study was conducted between March 24 and March 26, 2015, during 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. It was determined that the average parking occupancy (77%), was sufficient enough to move forward with the proposed parking restrictions.
- C. There is sufficient funding within the Parking Division’s Fiscal Year 2015/16 operating budget to implement the recommended parking regulation.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:


Section 1. The following streets will be regulated with “3 Hour Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Excluding Sundays:”

- 3rd Street, west side, from Capitol Mall to O Street
- Front Street, west side, from Neasham Circle to O Street
- N Street, both sides, from 2nd Street to 3rd Street


The following streets will be regulated with “90 Minute Parking, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Excluding Sundays:”

- 3rd Street, west side, from O Street to P Street
- O Street, north side, from 2nd Street to 3rd Street
- 2nd Street, both sides, from N Street to O Street
