Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: The 250 feet of wooden dock on the waterfront in Old Sacramento is past its useful life and in need of replacement. The dock provides boater access to and from Old Sacramento, and connectivity between the two dock access ramps to the waterfront. The dock connection is required by the State Lands Commission.

Policy Considerations: The recommendation in this report is in accordance with the provisions of City Code Chapter 3.60 and Section 11 of Resolution No. 2015-0169.

Economic Impacts: None.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): In accordance with Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines, no environmental review is necessary because the recommendation in this report involves a formal authorization for a grant application, which can be seen with certainty to have no significant effect on the environment. Additional environmental review will be required if the grant application is successful and the Old Sacramento Waterfront Dock project progresses.

Sustainability: Not applicable

Commission/Committee Action: On February 2, 2013, as a part of the mid-year budget process, the Budget Committee recommended allocation of the bond funds as described below.

Rationale for Recommendation: The Department of Parks and Recreation, Division of Boating and Waterways offers local assistance loan and grant programs to support the development and improvement of marinas and boat launching facilities. One of the requirements of the grant application process is a formal authorization to apply for grant funds from the official government body of the applicant.

Financial Considerations: The Department of Parks and Recreation, Division of Boating and Waterways, Boating Facilities Development and Financing grant program does not require matching funds, however, the competitiveness of the grant increases significantly when the applicant provides matching funds. This report recommends City matching funds in the amount of \$200,000 in 2006 Capital Improvement Revenue Bonds, Series A funds (Fund 3004) to the project. Project funding will be provided as follows:
