Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: The City operates its Permanent Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility (PHHWCF) at the Sacramento Recycling and Transfer Station, located at 8491 Fruitridge Road, where residents may drop off household hazardous waste (e.g., antifreeze, batteries, bulbs, oil, and paint) at no charge. CalRecycle is currently accepting applications for Cycle 27 of its Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Grant Program. The Recycling and Solid Waste Division is seeking this grant to fund the installation of an awning at the PHHWCF to protect residents and workers from inclement weather and mitigate water pollutant runoff while properly disposing of HHW. CalRecycle requires the governing body of the applicant to provide a signed resolution authorizing the grant application.

Policy Considerations: The recommendations in this report are consistent with the City's Climate Action Plan goal of achieving a healthy living environment (Strategy 4) by maximizing proper disposal of hazardous and other solid waste material.

Economic Impacts: None

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): No environmental review is necessary because the recommendations in this report involve the administrative activity of applying for grant funding and are not considered to be a project in accordance with Section 15378(b)(2) of the CEQA Guidelines.

Sustainability: Facility improvements to the PHHWCF will ensure that it will continue to operate in a safe and clean manner, and have the capacity to process and store the disposed HHW.

Commission/Committee Action: None

Rationale for Recommendation: CalRecycle requires the governing body of the applicant to provide a signed resolution authorizing the grant application. The Department of Public Works, Recycling and Solid Waste Division will use this grant funding to install an awning at the PHHWCF to protect residents and workers from inclement weather and mitigate water pollutant runoff while properly disposing of HHW.

Financial Considerations: This report recommends applying for grant funding in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 from the CalRecycle HHW Grant Program – Cycle 27. No matching funds are required for this grant and there is no impact to the General Fund. If the grant funds are awarded revenue and expenditure budgets will be established in the Solid Waste Repair and Rehabilitation Project (Y14000900, Other Capital Grants, Fund 3704).

APPLICATION FOR THE CALRECYCLE HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE GRANT PROGRAM – CYCLE 27 (Y14000900)

BACKGROUND

- A. The City of Sacramento accepts household hazardous waste for disposal at the Permanent Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility, located at 8491 Fruitridge Road. The improper disposal of household hazardous waste is costly, environmentally hazardous, and in violation of state law.
- B. CalRecycle is currently accepting applications for Cycle 27 of its Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Grant Program. The Recycling and Solid Waste Division is seeking this grant to fund the installation of an awning at the PHHWCF to protect residents and workers from inclement weather and mitigate water pollutant runoff while properly disposing of HHW.
- C. CalRecycle grant application procedures require an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations related to the administration of CalRecycle grants.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to apply for the CalRecycle Household Hazardous Waste Grant Program – Cycle 27 in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.
- Section 2. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to execute the grant agreement and all related documents, if awarded.
- Section 3. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to establish revenue and expenditure budgets in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 in the Solid Waste Repair and Rehabilitation Project (Y14000900), if awarded.
