Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: The opening of the Golden 1 Center will increase pedestrian traffic in the areas near the downtown arena before and after events. To help keep the area free of debris, the Recycling and Solid Waste Division (Division) is working with the Downtown Sacramento Partnership and the Sacramento Solid Waste Authority to co-locate garbage and beverage container recycling bins in heavy pedestrian traffic areas.

CalRecycle is currently accepting applications for its FY2016/17 Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program. The Division is seeking this grant to fund the purchase of bins that promote recycling and are tamper proof to prevent scavenging. The number of bins and their locations will be dependent on the amount of grant funding received.

Policy Considerations: The recommendations in this report are consistent with the City's Master Plan goals of achieving zero waste, increasing diversion of waste, and city recycling by maximizing the number of beverage recycling containers in high pedestrian traffic flow areas.

Economic Impacts: None

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): No environmental review is necessary because the recommendations in this report involve the administrative activity of applying for grant funding and are not considered to be a project in accordance with Section 15378(b)(2) of the CEQA Guidelines.

Sustainability: Installing beverage recycling containers on the sidewalks near the Golden 1 Center and on K Street will increase the amount of recyclables diverted from the City's waste stream.

Commission/Committee Action: None

Rationale for Recommendation: CalRecycle requires the governing body of the applicant to provide a signed resolution authorizing the grant application. The installation of tamper proof recycling containers in high pedestrian traffic areas around the Golden 1 Center and on K Street will provide increased opportunities for recycling, help promote cleaner streets, and encourage visitors to the area.

Financial Considerations: This report recommends applying for grant funding in an amount not to exceed \$250,000 from the FY2016/17 CalRecycle Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program. No matching funds are required for this grant and there is no impact to the General Fund. If the grant funds are awarded revenue and expenditure

budgets will be established in the Downtown Street Cans Project (G15002500, Solid Waste Grant Fund, Fund 6207).

APPLICATION FOR THE FY2016/17 CALRECYCLE BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING GRANT (G15002500)

BACKGROUND

- A. Pedestrian traffic flow studies for the Golden 1 Center and for the Downtown Sacramento Partnership indicate downtown sidewalks near the Golden 1 Center will increase to approximately 11,000 people before and after events. Specifically, K Street will serve as a main thoroughfare for pedestrian traffic flow due to the light rail station and surrounding businesses.
- B. Pedestrian traffic flow correlates well with increased opportunities for recycling. Additional beverage container recycling receptacles are needed near the Golden 1 Center and K Street to subsidize recyclables diverted from the City's waste stream.
- C. CalRecycle is currently accepting applications for the FY2016/17 Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program. The Recycling and Solid Waste Division is seeking this grant to purchase uniform receptacles that promote recycling and are tamper proof to prevent scavenging. The beverage container recycling receptacles will be placed in strategic locations on the sidewalks near the Golden 1 Center and on K Street.
- D. CalRecycle grant application procedures require an applicant's governing body to declare by resolution certain authorizations related to the administration of CalRecycle grants. The resolution should 1) authorize the local agency to apply for the grant; 2) identify a specific individual to execute grant documents; and 3) indicate the effective time period during which grant documents including agreements, reports, etc. may need to be executed.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City of Sacramento is authorized to apply for the FY2016/17 CalRecycle Beverage Container Recycling Grant Program in an amount not to exceed \$250,000.

Section 2. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee, Jerry Way, Director of Public Works, is authorized to execute the grant agreement and all related documents, if awarded, through July 18, 2021.

Section 3. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to establish revenue and expenditure budgets in an amount not to exceed \$250,000 in the Downtown Street Cans Project (G15002500, Solid Waste Grant Fund, Fund 6207), if awarded.
