Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: The Department of Parks and Recreation recommends establishing a capital improvement project (CIP) as the Rodrigo 'Rod' Rodriguez Jr. Soccer Field Security Fencing Project at Oak Park (L19144600) and appropriate \$97,000 from Quimby Act funds to the Project (L19144600). The funds will be used to develop construction documents and for the construction of the perimeter security fencing around the soccer field.

Oak Park is an existing 8.10-acre community park located at 3425 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. in Council District 5. Current proposed improvements consist of installation of a chain link fence, maintenance gates and pedestrian gates around the soccer field perimeter.

Policy Considerations: As stated in City Council Resolution No. 2016-0216, Section 10.2, City Council approval is required to establish a CIP project.

Providing parks and recreation facilities is consistent with the City's strategic plan to enhance livability in Sacramento's neighborhoods by expanding park, recreation, and trail facilities throughout the City. This is also part of the Park Development Process for park planning as stated in the *2005-2010 Parks and Recreation Master Plan*.

Economic Impacts: None

Environmental Considerations: The Environmental Services Manager has determined that the proposed project is exempt from CEQA under Section Number 15303 of the CEQA Guidelines. Section 15303 consists of construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities, or structures.

Sustainability: The Rodrigo 'Rod' Rodriguez Jr. Soccer Field Security Fencing Project has been reviewed for consistency with the goals, policies, and targets of the City's Sustainability Master Plan (SMP), the Parks and Recreation Sustainability Plan, and the 2035 General Plan. The Project will advance the goals, policies, and targets of these plans by improving the health of residents through access to a diverse mix of wellness and recreation activities. The park improvements are also consistent with sustainable design through the use of recycled materials, and use of local vendors.

Commission/Committee Action: None

Rationale for Recommendation: A fence around the existing soccer field is needed to create a safe play space for school age children. The recommendations in this report will allow staff to move forward with the Rodrigo 'Rod' Rodriguez Jr. Soccer Field Security Fencing Project at Oak Park.

Financial Considerations: The proposed action is to appropriate \$97,000 from Quimby Act available fund balance (Fund 2508) to the Project(L19144600). There are sufficient available funds in Fund 2508 to appropriate to the project.

This is an existing park; the annual maintenance and utilities costs are covered in the Department of Parks and Recreation's operating budget for maintenance, water, and utility costs.

ESTABLISHING THE RODRIGO 'ROD' RODRIGUEZ JR. SOCCER FIELD SECURITY FENCING PROJECT AT OAK PARK AND APPROPRIATE FUNDING

BACKGROUND

- A. Oak Park is an 8.10-acre community park located at 3425 Martin Luther King Jr. Blvd. in Council District 5. Existing park amenities include community center, child care center, amphitheater, parking lot, wading pool, lighted basketball court, tot lot, adventure play area and the Rodrigo 'Rod' Rodriguez Jr. Soccer Field.
- B. City Council approval is required to establish a CIP project.
- C. With this recommendation, funds will be used to develop construction documents and construct perimeter fencing around the soccer field.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. A new capital improvement project for the Rodrigo 'Rod' Rodriguez Jr. Soccer Field Security Fencing Project at Oak Park is hereby established as L19144600.
- Section 2. The appropriation of \$97,000 of Quimby Act available fund balance (Fund 2508) to the Rodrigo 'Rod' Rodriguez Jr. Soccer Field Security Fencing Project at Oak Park (L19144600) is hereby approved.
