5	1.04.2	Update on Sign Ordinance and Sign Program	CM Waters/CDD/ Joy Patterson / CAO / TBD	Spring 2010	Staff is doing a citywide study and will come back to the committee when it is completed. Staff held several council workshops to get feedback and direction before returning with a comprehensive proposed ordinance for committee consideration in early 2009. The Committee provided feedback and directed staff to report back. CM Cohn asked that staff review the City of Portland's program for A-Frame signs and report as to whether this program can be implemented in the City as a pilot program. STATUS: Staff has drafted an ordinance amendment that authorizes digital billboards (which the city code currently prohibits) and a relocation agreement as part of a subset of this project. That ordinance is scheduled for the April 6, 2010 meeting of the Law & Legislation Committee. Work on the comprehensive revision will resume once the digital-billboard project is done.
6	1.05.2	Amend Tree Ordinance	DOT/Joe Benassini	Late 2010	Minor changes were approved by L&L April 2008 and by City Council June 2008. Revised draft ordinance and outreach efforts underway. Item is going to Council June 2009. Amend the City's Tree Ordinance to add section to amend the tree permit appeals process. STATUS: This item is being reviewed by an outside consultant and will probably be heard in late 2010.

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7	5.05.2	Housing Trust Fund Ordinance Revisions	Community Development Dept/ Greg Sandlund	Summer 2010	Staff is preparing an off-agenda memo for Nexus study and will be bringing the Housing Trust Fund portion forward in early 2009 for minor technical revisions. Item heard by Council on April 18 as part of the Affordable Housing Workshop. Based on the recommendations by Council, staff will bring this item to L&L. STATUS: In 2004, a Council resolution directed staff to make minor technical changes to the Housing Trust Fund Ordinance. After a more thorough review of the ordinance, the necessary changes have been determined to be more significant than anticipated. These modifications will require significant staff time to conduct outreach to all necessary stakeholders. In light of the current budget situation, our department lacks the staff resources at this time to make the necessary changes to the Housing Trust Fund Ordinance. <u>Please note: this item will be removed from the next version of the log.</u>
8	8.05.1	Amend Ordinance Relating to Illegal Dumping Conviction Reward Program	CM Waters / Utilities / Edison Hicks	Pending	Amend ordinance relating to reward program to allow payment of reward at arrest and prosecution for illegal dumping. STATUS: No update at this time.

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9	4.07.1	Home Occupation Permit re: Somatic Massage	L&L Committee/ Finance Dept./ Brad Wasson	Pending	The Revenue Division distributed a memo on this item on June 8, 2010. As of July 30, 2008 Revenue Division and Code Enforcement staff said they would be providing a joint report back on both Items 7.06.1 and 4.07.1. At the 4/17/07 L&L meeting the Committee directed staff to come back with options to amend the home occupation permit. STATUS: The State has enacted new requirements for massage practitioners that impact the city's ability to regulate this industry. City code will need to be updated to comply with the State changes. The request to allow somatic massage practitioners to operate out of their home with a Home Occupation permit will be folded in with the State review. The Revenue Division met with the CAO to determine what needs to change. Staff recommends not modifying the code at this time until the state situation stabilizes.
10	4.07.3	Discussion Paper on Portable Gas Leaf Blowers	CM Waters / Community Development / Tina Lee-Vogt & CMO	Pending	Off Agenda memo sent to City Council on July 15, 2008 recommending no further action. At the 08/19/08 Committee meeting, CM Waters asked that this item remain on the log and that staff report back to the committee regarding noise complaints and their responses. STATUS: Code staff is researching other cities' regulation policies and is preparing an update for L&L.
11	3.09.5	Ordinance Amendment: Police Alarms	Police Department / Jim Maccoun	Pending	This ordinance amendment is a revision of Chapter 8.36 of the City Code, regarding alarm systems, regulation and false alarm reduction. The ordinance is still going through revisions in the City Attorney's Office. STATUS: Staff is currently in the process of discussing next steps and dates.

STATUS: The CAO is looking into this request. There is an issue of preemption. The City cannot supplement the building code without specific findings that local conditions require a regulation that goes beyond statewide building code standards.

STATUS: A memo was sent in regards to preparation for a ballot measure on this topic. This item is projected to be heard in late Winter 2010.

STATUS: Staff is focused on implementing the first phase and hopes to get it up and running to learn how to best implement future phases. Newsracks were installed on K Street in early 2010.
15	8.09.6	Egg-Laying Chickens	CMO / Michelle Heppner	Summer 2010	Staff is bringing forward a discussion paper with regard to a possible ordinance that would allow egg-laying chickens in back yards. STATUS: Staff is currently conducting research in preparation for a discussion paper.

The proposed Ordinance seeks to reduce the number of false fire alarms by promoting responsible maintenance practices from fire alarm system owners. Also, the proposed Ordinance seeks to impose a false fire alarm penalty after multiple false fire alarms from the same system within a 365 day period. Outreach completed and tentative final draft is being revised. Will be meeting with CAO for final review before legislative process. STATUS: No update at this time.
