



Dear Ms. Deering, Mr. Paul and to Whom it concerns:

I am applying for a position on the Preservation Commission to further engage in the conversation about what is appropriate design for our growing City and as a way of serving my community.

My 35 plus years of training as both an architect and a builder – and in the last 20 years one who specializes in design and construction work on vintage homes and structures -gives me some unique qualifications for this position.

I have also recently been teaching (an online course since Fall of 2010) called “Introduction to Green Building” at Cosumnes River College. This has provided me an opportunity to be involved with guiding students in the fundamentals of sustainable practices in design and construction.

While I have interest in Preservation and Green Building, I am greatly interested in innovative state of the art techniques of building and construction. I recently was involved in designing affordable housing for the City of Crescent City, CA that utilized pre-fabrication “kit of parts” SIPs panel techniques and re-purposed steel shipping containers. I designed and got approved the first steel shipping container modular home in the Sacramento Area (to my knowledge) that is now near completion in the City of Citrus Heights.

I am interested in engaging our design community in the larger issues of sustainability and in particular the discussion around what architectural forms are appropriate for our region and climate. I would like to see us not just discussing what is appropriate in immediate and adjacent context, but what is appropriate for Sacramento, for the present moment going into the second decade of the 21st Century. The real question needs to be: What can we be designing and building today that will be worth preserving 100 years or more in the future?

I hope you will consider my application and appointment for service to our community.

Recommendation of Matthew Piner for the Preservation Commission

Dear Mayor and City Council Members,

It is of my opinion that Matthew Piner is an ideal candidate for the position of licensed general contractor with preservation experience on the City of Sacramento Preservation Commission. Mr. Piner is both a licensed general contractor and a licensed architect, skills that he combines in his "design-build" business. In addition, he had significant knowledge of sustainable "green" building practices and materials, which he emphasizes not only in his projects, but also in his teaching as an adjunct Professor at Cosumnes River College.

I became familiar with Mr. Piner's work when I served as Vice Chair of the City of Sacramento's former Design Review and Preservation Board. Mr. Piner's designs for additions to and modifications of historic structures focus on allowing project proponents to make their residences more livable, given present life styles, while preserving the architectural integrity and character defining features of the original structure. His sensitivity for incorporating the new with the old in a pleasing manner while following the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for Treatment of Historic Properties would add a valuable perspective to the Preservation Commission. I was so impressed with his experience and expertise that I hired Mr. Piner to design the foundation replacement and basement, bathroom and sunroom additions to my own home, a City Landmark 1878 Italianate Victorian in Boulevard Park, and to serve as one of my contractors for that project. His design has been approved as conforming with the California Historical Building Code, the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties, and the Historic Preservation Chapter, 17.134, of the Sacramento Municipal Code.

For these reasons, I urge you to appoint Matthew Piner to the position of licensed general contractor with preservation experience on the City of Sacramento Preservation Commission.

I am a long time activist on behalf of historic preservation in the city of Sacramento. I am currently finishing my second and final term on the Preservation Commission and have had the privilege of serving as Commission Chair for the past two years. I also chair the Sacramento Heritage Board. It is my great pleasure to recommend Matthew Piner for the now open general contractor position on the Commission.

I have known Mr. Piner for many years and am familiar with his work as both a general contractor and an architect. He is knowledgeable with regard to the Secretary of Interior Standards for the rehabilitation of historic buildings and, over the years, has been responsible for the sensitive rehabilitation of many historic buildings in Sacramento including the Midtown home in which he and his family live. Mr. Piner is also an adjunct professor at Consumnes River College teaching classes on energy efficiency and effective ways to retrofit older buildings to bring them up to current energy standards. Energy efficiency and retrofit is currently a very important topic in preservation and Mr. Piner's knowledge in this area will enrich the Commission's understanding of all the projects it reviews. It will also help the Commission address policy issues having to do with energy efficiency.

I know from experience that the knowledge and perspective that a general contractor who has successfully rehabbed historic buildings brings to the Commission is key to the Commission making good decisions and recommendations. I also know that the Commission badly needs the energy efficiency expertise that Mr. Piner has to offer and that this need will only increase as energy costs increase and energy efficiency rules become more stringent. The fact that Mr. Piner is an architect as well as a general contractor adds to the strength of his credentials.

Reason for Applying:

Sacramento's future as a first class city is intimately tied to preserving and building on its individuality, its sense of place. Sacramento has a fascinating and storied past, from early settlements based on Mexican land grants, to the Gold Rush, to early statehood as a free state leading up to the Civil War, to the western terminus of both the Pony Express and the Transcontinental Railroad. This indomitable city has raised itself an entire story to defeat devastating floods and fought hard to become and then retain the seat of our state's government. Through all of these and more recent events, Sacramento has developed and acquired a fascinating diversity of historic and cultural treasures. These resources deserve our attention as we grow and develop to accommodate our modern infrastructure, industry, commerce, and an ever-increasing population.

I moved to Sacramento in 1981 to become part of the environmental protection agency of our state's government. Dr. Marshack is a long time resident of the historic Boulevard Park neighborhood in Sacramento's Central City. He serves on the board of the Boulevard Park Neighborhood Association and has been the board's Preservation Chair. He is also a member of the board of directors of the Sacramento Old City Association. He served on the former Design Review and Preservation Board and, in that capacity, worked on the Preservation Subcommittee of the former Development Oversight Commission to develop the proposal that resulted in the creation of the current Preservation Commission. 





It is my sincere pleasure to write in support of Jon Marshack's application to the City of Sacramento Preservation Commission. Jon is an ideal candidate for the commission. 

Reason for Applying:

Sacramento's future as a first class city is intimately tied to preserving and building on its individuality, its sense of place. Sacramento has a fascinating and storied past, from early settlements based on Mexican land grants, to the Gold Rush, to early statehood as a free state leading up to the Civil War, to the western terminus of both the Pony Express and the Transcontinental Railroad. This indomitable city has raised itself an entire story to defeat devastating floods and fought hard to become and then retain the seat of our state's government. Through all of these and more recent events, Sacramento has developed and acquired a fascinating diversity of historic and cultural treasures. These resources deserve our attention as we grow and develop to accommodate our modern infrastructure, industry, commerce, and an ever-increasing population.

I moved to Sacramento in 1981 to become part of the environmental protection agency of our state's government. What made me stay were the unique expressions of Sacramento's past in its well-preserved and diverse architecture and historic and cultural resources, as well as the sense of community and engagement I experienced in its walkable, tree canopied Central City neighborhoods.

I have worked to preserve and enhance the quality of life in both the Central City and Oak Park neighborhoods. I advocated including more housing in the R Street Corridor plan. I restored one historic Oak Park home as my residence before tackling the renovation of my City Landmark home in Boulevard Park. I served as Preservation Chair of the Boulevard Park Neighborhood Association to retain and enhance that neighborhood's unique mix of architecture. I worked with the Development Oversight Commission and then became a member of the Design Review and Preservation Board to help formulate a new Preservation Ordinance that would lead to the dissolution of that board in order to create the Preservation Commission. I helped to develop a new set of design and infill development standards for our historic districts that I hope to see adopted some day soon. As a member of the Save our Rail Depot Steering Committee, the Sacramento Old City Association's Board of Directors, and the Board of the Capital City Preservation Trust, I have worked to focus community energy and funding toward projects that protect and enhance our City's historic and cultural resources. Now I seek to become a member of the Preservation Commission to further pursue these objectives, mainly through the formulation of policies and plans to make community involvement more effective, to resolve our infill development needs, and to create a higher degree of predictability for those who would build our City's future.

It is my sincere pleasure to write in support of Jon Marshack's application to the City of Sacramento Preservation Commission. Jon is an ideal candidate for the commission. He is a former member of the Design Review and Preservation Board, he is an active preservation advocate, and he owns and is actively restoring an historic home on H Street.

As the selection committee is well aware, Jon has participated in city preservation issues for many years. He has served on a variety of committees both at the city and neighborhood level. He brings to this service nearly thirty years of personal experience living in the city's oldest neighborhoods and oldest homes. He understands preservation issues and concerns not merely from an appreciation of architectural styles, historic periods, and government regulations, but from the standpoint of how preserved buildings enhance the lived experience of the city's residents. 


