Recommendation: Conduct a public hearing and upon conclusion, adopt a **Resolution** 1) accepting the Findings of Fact denying the appeal and 2) approving the Tentative Map to subdivide 1.37± gross acres into eight single-family lots and the Special Permit to construct a single-family residence upon each lot.
