Adopted by the Sacramento City Council

SOUTH HOLLYWOOD PARK NEIGHBORHOOD TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PROGRAM PROJECT PHASE 1 TRAFFIC CALMING PLAN APPROVAL (PN: TN65)

BACKGROUND

- A. In December of 1995, the Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP) was adopted by City Council and officially began in May 1996.
- B. The South Hollywood Park Neighborhood NTMP Project (PN: TN65) began in October 2005. The project has followed the NTMP guidelines established by council resolution. Exhibit A identifies project boundaries.
- C. A traffic calming plan has been designed by residents serving on the Traffic Calming Committee and voted on by neighborhood residents with a 88% approval rate. Exhibit B (attached) is the ballot.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The South Hollywood Park Neighborhood Traffic Management Program Project Phase 1 Traffic Calming Plan (PN: TN65) is approved.





Do you want traffic calming measures in your neighborhood?

You have the opportunity to vote on a traffic calming plan for your neighborhood. This vote is to determine if the measures recommended by the Traffic Calming Committee (TCC), which consists of residents from your neighborhood, will be implemented.

The TCC assisted city staff in developing the plan. Various measures were reviewed and agreed upon by the TCC.

Your Vote Counts!

Every address (residence) can be given 1 vote in your neighborhood has returned this notice and ballot. Now is your opportunity to vote for or against the proposed traffic calming measures.

You and your neighbors will decide whether or not the traffic calming measures will be implemented in your neighborhood.

If enough votes are in favor, the plan will be presented to City Council for review. If approved and funding is available, a minimum of 25% of all ballots must be returned with a simple majority in favor of the plan.

Proposed Measures for Your Neighborhood

Below are the recommended measures. If approved, the measures will be constructed at no cost to residents and /or homeowners. You are asked to vote in favor of or against the entire traffic calming plan which includes the following measures:

Speed Humps - Install on:

- ◆ Murmeta Way between Camelia Way & Helen Way;
- ◆ Murmeta Way between Helen Way & Dana Way;
- ◆ Murmeta Way between Hooke Way & 24th St.
- ◆ Hooke Way between Murmeta Way & 24th St.
- ◆ Knight Way between Murmeta Way & 24th St.
- ◆ Frontidge Frontage Road between Camelia Way and 23rd St.
- ◆ Helen Way between Stover Way & Murmeta Way;
- ◆ Dana Way between Stover and Murmeta Way.

Curve Warning Signs - Place on:


- ◆ Murmeta Way at Carmen Way and Knight Way

25 Pavement Legend - Install on:

- ◆ Camelia Way, north of Frontidge Rd.
- ◆ Helen Way, north of Frontidge Rd.
- ◆ Dana Way, north of Frontidge Rd.
- ◆ 23rd St. north of Frontidge Rd.

Neighborhood Signs, which remind drivers to "Please Drive Safely" in Hollywood Park. Install signs on:

- ◆ Murmeta Way, east of Fresport Bl.
- ◆ Helen Way, north of Frontidge Rd.
- ◆ Dana Way, north of Frontidge Rd.
- ◆ Knight Way, west of 24th St.
- ◆ Oregon Way, east of Fresport Bl.
